The VA&R program governs two categories of Auxiliary volunteers: Veterans Affairs Voluntary Service (VAVS) volunteers and Service to Veterans volunteers. The biggest challenge the Auxiliary faces is our approach to meeting the needs of a multigenerational volunteer force. Think about how we appeal to several generations of potential volunteers and how each of those generations with their own mindset and value system can be embraced in volunteer service.

- Be welcoming to all, regardless of the volunteer's American Legion Auxiliary membership status.
- Look for opportunities to mentor other volunteers all of us have unique talents and skills that can be successfully utilized.
- Pair personal and professional talents with interesting volunteer opportunities.
- Provide opportunities where volunteers can grow personally and professionally.
- Identify challenging assignments where volunteers can see quick results.
- Make use of technology whenever possible and ask for help if you need it.

The Department of California Auxiliary needs volunteers for both VAVS and Service to Veterans. Interested members should contact me for information on how and where you can volunteer.
