The State of California website tells us that HHS provides oversight to departments and state entities that support our most vulnerable citizens. The State HHS mission is to work together with counties and cities to make the State a healthy place to live, play, work, and learn. Likewise, the ALA Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation program oversees the work done by our Districts and Units to improve the quality of life for California veterans.

This Chairman will be the Secretary of HHS, District Chairs will be Administrative Assistants and Unit Chairs will be Administrative Aides. So, let's get to work! The annual **Impact Report** is a vital part of the year-end reporting process for VA&R and will be required again in 2023-24 for all units and districts. The data you report on the form will eventually find its way into the annual American Legion report that is presented to Congress each year. Remember – every hour, dollar,

and mile that you devote to veterans is reportable, so please stress to ALL ALA members in your districts and units the importance of keeping **Tracking Sheets** current throughout the year; it will make the reporting process so much easier, and will provide a much more accurate accounting of time and money spent, and hours volunteered for VA&R during the year.

You are encouraged to read the materials provided in your VA&R packet now and use them for reference during the year. Study the VA&R Department Code, which was amended by the members at Convention in June. Visit the VA&R page on the Department website and download "The Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation: A Guide for Volunteers" Booklet. The Guide and updated Department Code will provide you with most of the information needed for a successful chairmanship!
