Recently, I have heard several unit members say, "We were never told that before". As a reminder, Unit Presidents and any member(s) should attend each District meeting to represent their Unit for roll call and



membership. This is where you will receive updates on events, requirements, notices from Department, etc.

As of this article, each unit should have completed your annual audit! The signed Audit form along with a copy of your tax filing receipt must be mailed or emailed to your District President. As of today, I have only received 2 Units Audit reports with the required Tax filing copies. **THIS IS A MUST!**

As of April 1^{st,} 2023, the new raffle period will begin 1.1.2024.

Raffles: If your Unit chooses to have 50/50's or any other type of raffles you MUST now have a permit to do so. Remember 90 percent of the gross receipts from these raffles go directly to beneficial or charitable purposes.

I recommend you take the course online, once complete you can pay for the permit. Most important, be informed. The permit is annual, so if you choose to get your permit now, you will have to renew the permit come January 2024. Failure to have this permit can cost your unit some serious fines with the possibility of losing your 501c. IRS is clamping down on all raffles.
