Americanism LINDA DIEBEL

Americanism is defined as "Attachments or allegiance to the traditions, institutions and ideals of the United States."

The main project in the Americanism program is the "Americanism Essay Contest," but not every Unit will be able to participate in this project, so what can this Unit do to work the Americanism program? Well, there are several ways to promote our Americanism program – these are:

- 1. Promote voting.
 - a. Host candidates' events at your Post be sure to offer the Post for all candidates.
 - b. Offer the Post as a voting location work with the Legion and the City, County or State to set up the Post as a voting location.

- 2. Promote displaying of the American Flag (this is a wonderful way to work with the Legion Americanism Chairperson).
 - a. Offer flags to businesses.
 - b. Offer flags to veterans or veteran homes.
 - c. Ask members to display the American Flag at their homes.
- 3. Work with your city to promote Patriotic events in your city.
 - a. Work at fairs and carnivals.
 - b. Work parades.
- 4. Promote Flag education.
 - a. Offer patriotic comic books to local elementary schools.
 - i. Purchase books from the Emblem Sales Catalog at <u>emblem.legion.org</u>.
 - ii. Cost is \$0.85 per book or \$0.65 per book if ordering 100+.
 - b. Offer information on the history of our Flag (also available at Emblem Sales).
- 5. Promote Blue Star and Glod Star Programs.
 - a. Offer Blue Star Banners at your city events to those who have family member in the services.
 - b. Offer Glod Star Banners at your city Memorial Services, Veterans Day Celebrations, or any other Patriotic events.

Every Unit can work the Americanism Program, just pick one or two of the items listed above or produce a new idea that works for your Unit. Also work with the Education or Children and Youth programs and split the cost of the project. I look forward to reading your Mid-year reports. For God and Country

KEY SERVICES: Operation Homefront provides direct services to alleviate a military family or an individual with actual/complete emergency financial burden, as well as counseling and/or recovery support. Emergency financial assistance, which an applicant receives is within 24 to 72 hours of a request, provided in the form of a check paid directly to mortgage lenders, auto mechanics, contractors, hospitals, doctors, dentists, and other providers.
