CHILDREN & YOUTH Bonnie Christner

Direct aid and service to children of veterans and military families:

Much of the Children and Youth work of the unit will be concerned with helping or getting help for individual families of veterans and military families who are in need. But, it has never been the intention of the C&Y program that an auxiliary unit should take over full and continuing responsibility for the financial support of dependent families. Did you know that eligibility for temporary financial assistance is limited to minor children of veterans? The parent must have served at least one day of active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States. And did you also know that membership in the American Legion or the American Legion Auxiliary is not required? Minor children include any unmarried child, stepchild, and adopted child 17 years or younger. Children 18 - 20 years old will be considered if a current disability requires special schooling or indefinite in-home care, or they are enrolled in an approved high school. Temporary Financial Assistance is specifically designed to assist minor children of eligible veterans through



cash grants. In order to maintain a stable home environment for a child or children, grants are awarded to help families meet the costs of shelter, utilities, food, and medical expenses.

Maintenance Grants: Maintenance grants may be used to assist with basic need expenses such as shelter, food, utilities and clothing.

Medical Grants: Medical grants for a child may be used to assist with healthcare expenses such as medical care, surgery, medications, dental care, hospitalization and dietary needs. Do you as an auxiliary member or unit know of any such family that might be in need of Temporary Financial Assistance. If you do please go the Children and Youth program on the department website and look up the requirements that you need to be able to help such a family. And, make sure to follow all the rules that's very important. If I can ever be of any help to any of you ladies out there, please don't hesitate to give me a call.



COMMUNITY SERVICE Mahala Beery



EDUCATION Hila Estrada

Please be aware that Eligibility for all educational scholarships to be awarded by the Department of California shall be granted only to students attending schools in California and who are a veteran, son, daughter, or spouse of a veteran. Unit chairman are to submit the winning scholarship. to their District Education Chairman by March 1st. The District Chairman is to submit the winning scholarship to the Department Chairman no later than March 15th, 2024.

CONNIE SETTLES SCHOLARSHIP

one \$5,000 scholarship is given annually and may include the cost of books.

Who is eligible to apply? Senior members or junior members who are ready to attending college.

Due to the unit chairman by March 1st: due to the Department chairmen by March 15th, 2024.

<u>LUCILLE GANEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP</u> The applicant must attend Stephen's College in Columbus, Missouri.

This is due to the unit chairman by March 1st; due to the Department Chairman by March 15th, 2024.

<u>PPP NURSES SCHOLARSHIP</u> One \$4,000 nursing scholarship annually.

Who is eligible to apply? A veteran or Veteran's wife or husband, widow or a widower, or child of a veteran. The veteran's period of service eligibility is April 16, 1917 -- Nov 11th, 1918, or ant time after December 7th, 1941, to the date cessation of hostilities as determined by the government of the United States.

Due to the Department PPP chairman no later than the third Friday in April.

EDUCATIONAL ASSIST GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP

One \$2,000 scholarship payable at \$1,000 per year

FOUR \$1,000 scholarship payable At 1,000 each

Three \$500 scholarship payable at \$500 each

<u>CONTINUING /RE-ENTRY</u> <u>STUDENTS OR STU-</u> DENTS PURSUING HIGHER DEGREE SCHOLARSHIP

Who is eligible to apply?

Children of a veteran who was in the Armed forces of the United States during membership eligibility periods.

- * One \$1,000 Mel Foronda Memorial Scholarship
- Two \$1,000 Scholarship Payable at 1,000 each
- * Three \$500 Scholarship payable at \$500 each.

The following four scholarship are restricted to winning California candidates in the event there is not a winner in Western Division National Scholarship Competition, provided funds are available.

- * One \$500 Spirit of Youth for Junior Scholarship
- * One \$500 National President's Scholarship
- * One \$500 National President's Non-traditional Scholarship
- One \$500 National Junior Member Loyalty scholarship

Ladies, I hope you had the chance to respond to the Sept. 9th Alert to urge Congress to support H.R. 5641 and 'Pay Our Troops' This was introduced in order to pay all uniformed military as well as civilian support staff, in the event of a government shutdown. If you missed it, there is still time for you to contact your congressman although you will have to go through regular channels such as e-mail, letter, calls etc. the trend of CA Vets leaving the state in search of a lower cost of living.

Assembly Bill <u>AB2032</u> would establish a "Green Alert emergency system" managed by the CA Highway Patrol, or CHP, to combat veteran suicide in the state. Like exiting Amber and Silver alerts, with proper cause, the CHP would be granted the power to issue an alert to the public for a veteran thought to be at risk for suicide.

Ending veteran suicide in CA remains a top priority for policymakers. Earlier this month, the governor's office announced a proposal to establish the CA Veterans Health Initiative, or <u>CVHI</u> which would evaluate current and future state policies, research, and management of care relating to veteran suicide in the state.

Operation Homefront was established to support the families of deployed service members immediately following 9/11. Headquartered in San Antonio, Texas, today OH provides services to military families across the nation with 23 chapters serving 32 states. The national office provides case management services in states that do not have their own chapters. The majority of clients are the lowest-paid servicemembers; E-1 through E-6 enlisted ranks. Through generous, widespread public support and a collaborative team of exceptional staff and volunteers, Operation Homefront aspires to become the provider of choice for emergency financial and other assistance to the families of our servicemembers and wounded warriors. Where there is a need we do not provide, Operation Homefront will partner with others for the benefit of our nation's military families.

KEY SERVICES

Operation Homefront provides direct services to alleviate a military family's or individual's actual/ complete emergency financial burden, as well as counseling and/or recovery support. Emergency financial assistance, which an applicant receives within 24 to 72 hours of request, is in the form of checks paid directly to mortgage lenders, auto mechanics, contractors, hospitals, doctors, dentists and other providers. There are several branches of Operation Homefront right here in California: Edwards AFB, Lemoore, Los Alamitos, Travis AFB, San Diego and Twentynine Palms.
