Please be prepared to provide an update so I can report this back to the Department. If your Unit received a letter from IRS, please forward that letter to me via email.

Unit Presidents, once your year is complete, you will be required to provide the following information to the District President.

- Unit Audit Report (Signed by Unit President and all members of Audit Committee)
- IRS 990N e-postcard or other 990 long forms required for all units NLT 9/30/24.
- CA FTB 199N e-postcard or 199 long forms required for all units NLT 9/30/24.
- Attorney General Registry of Charitable Trusts RRF-1 required for all units NLT 9/30/24.

Attorney General Registry of Charitable Trusts CT-TR-1 required for all units NLT 9/30/24.Note: The AG CT-TR-1 instructions state on the form that "special events" are one-time events (not your annual or ongoing events and fundraisers, which should be put on their form under program income).

Suicide should be our top issue when we think of our Veterans. Most of us don't realize the rate of suicide among Veterans is higher than it should be! We must work to stop suicide!

Working together we can help prevent suicide by having that difficult conversation about suicide and other mental health issues in our communities. **Fact:** 70% of Veterans will die by suicide within one hour of thinking about it. 20% will die by suicide withing 20 minutes of thinking about it.

We have so much work to do so we can take the necessary steps of training our members to spot the tell-tale signs that might be missed when talking to a Veteran or by spotting a Veteran who is suffering from PTSD or any other mental health illness. Being able to spot a Veteran is only the start. "Be the One" who is willing to take the first step and start the difficult conversation. Let's get informed, know the signs, and start a plan to deal with suicide. We need to STOP suicide among our Veterans!
