Great news, the Salute to Service Members Award is due June 1st and can be submitted on line at Submit any candidates here: https://www.legion-aux.org/Salute-to-Servicemembers-Award-Form

Units can submit as many candidates as possible.

Community Emergency Readiness Training (https://www.ready.gov/) so you can be ready when a disaster might happen. The site also provides resources to



help your community. CERT covers basic skills to help with aid in an emergency.

Being prepared can make all the difference to your survival. Having a pair of sneakers in your trunk along with heavy duty gloves, along with a windbreaker could make all the difference in getting home safely from work if you had to walk. Plan a route and let your family know how you will get home in the event you have to walk. Establish an out of state call center (a family member) where you can check in and have messages to other families in the event our local lines are clogged.

Keep a week of medicine along with a blanket, bottled water, and some canned goods. Remember you might have to live off your stash for a week.

Work with your local post and see if you can set up an emergency plan for your elderly veterans. You might consider making your hall a safe place in the event you need shelter.

These are just a few ideas on how you can prepare for emergencies.
