

#### **LEGISLATIVE**

Please know that a leaked VA memo shared the cutting of more than 80,000 VA jobs by end of Fiscal Year 2025. Ranking Member Sen. Richard Blumenthal, D-Conn., asked about the Legion's discussion with VA Secretary Doug Collins on this. "The American Legion has spoken with VA Secretary Doug Collins about the need for more transparency and methodology of these changes and plans to mitigate potential impacts," American Legion Veteran Affairs & Rehabilitation Director Cole Lyle replied, adding that the Legion has been in contact with the secretary's office about the department-wide personnel review by May 9 about the cuts. "We absolutely want to have the Legionnaires' voices heard in that process to ensure that there are no cuts in mission critical capabilities for health care or benefits at the VA" per Lyle. Blumenthal added that, "It is your voices and faces that will make a difference. At the end of the day it's our veterans who save VA health care, VA benefits, the Pact Act.'

AL Veteran Affairs and Rehab Director Cole Lyle testified March 11 before the Senate Committee on Vet Affairs regarding pending legislation. He answered questions from members about the Veterans Access Act, reduction in the U.S. Dept. of VA workforce, and privatizing VA. "It is vital to acknowledge that this hearing comes at a time of uncertainty and widespread change" Lyle stated. "I want to be clear. The American Legion has never shied away from the responsibility of being a voice for the veterans and we will not start now."

American Legion Auxiliary Department of California Legislative Chair Glenda Schultz states that as of January 29, 2025, we had 15,284 paid members and only 41 responses to the A. Action Alerts! California needs to get up to speed. The District. of Columbia was the winner in the National Legislative Committee Challenge for the first quarter. We have a lot of work to do ladies. She and I remind you that these are your Veterans benefits that you are supporting when you contact your reps through https:// www.votervoice.net/AmericanLegion/Registern it's so easy to sign up, receive the alerts and vote/speak up. The system automatically keeps track of your More planning information on Legislative issues may be found in the Legislative Advocacy Guide, and the American Dispatch. Also, if you have not already joined the Legislative Facebook page, please join now at ALA Legislative. This is a closed group, so you must request permission to join. You must then answer all questions to be approved. It is a method to share updates discuss national legislation, and stay connected with other members.

With our military and Veteran populations, there are a myriad of benefits to music therapy services that bolster recovery, rehabilitation, and resilience across treatment domains (e.g., physiological, neurological, psychological, social), as indicated below.

Happy April everyone!

Reports are due, I hope yours are on the way, if I haven't received them. It's a busy month for ALA activities and of course, Easter is on Sunday, April 20, 2025.



Last month Past National President Lisa Wiliamson asked for our help collecting coupons. It is a great opportunity to get members involved in working the mission of National Security, especially those members who may be homebound.

Below are some helpful tips and the contact information on where to send the coupons:

- 1. Only Manufacturer's Coupons may be used. This can include coupons for food, non-food items like hygiene or cleaning supplies, baby items such as diapers, and pet supplies. The commissary is unable to accept store coupons, restaurant coupons or internet coupons.
- 2. Cut out the coupons. Please do not send sheets of unclipped coupons.
- 3. Overseas Commissaries are permitted to accept expired manufacturer coupons up to 6 months past the expiration date. Be sure to consider the time it will take to mail the coupons and for the commissary to sort.
- 4. Try and sort the coupons before mailing: separate the expired (or soon to expire) from the nonexpired. Then separate and group together by type: Food, Non-food, baby & children, and pets.
- 5. Send the coupons to the below listed address: Yokosuka Commissary Attn: Mr. Sun T. Park PSC 473 Box 33 FPO AP 96349.

Our Department's National Security Chairman was able to go to Washington DC to attend some important meetings. Please check out her report on the ALA California Department website. Go to Resources, then Bulletins, then look at March 2025 Bulletin, under that is Washington Report. She attended meetings about Suicide Prevention where they spoke about VA collected data on Veteran Suicide and medications, another meeting about Veterans' Employment & Training Service, they also covered various housing programs, then they heard from the Small Business Administration and how they can help Veterans. She was there with several leaders from the Department of California and walked the hill visiting representatives. Please read the report (it's too long for here) but it shows how much the American Legion does to enhance veterans lives and well worth the time to read.



#### PAST PRESIDENTS PARLEY

UNITS: Deadline All student Nurses' application due on Friday, April 4, 2025. ALL completed and signed Nurses' applications to PPP Department Chairman by Friday, April 18, 2025.

The purpose of the Past Presidents Parley (PPP) committee is to utilize the experience and knowledge of past Auxiliary leaders for training and encouragement of future Auxiliary leaders. Through the Past Presidents Parley committee, women who have served as unit, department, and national presidents have an opportunity to continue in active service to the Auxiliary, helping ensure strong future leadership for the organization.



Nursing Scholarship: The Department of California offers a Nursing scholarship Application through the Parley, this support is intended for a man or woman who is educationally working toward becoming a nurse. Units are urged to continue to provide scholarships for student nurses. Our efforts in this area are important and help to relieve the nursing shortages as well as improve the quality of health care.

Estimates show California faces a shortage of about 36,000 licensed nurses, according to the UC San Francisco Health Workforce Research Center on Long-Term Care. (Jul 31, 2023)

Forecasts of the Registered Nurse Workforce in California (As Reported in UC San Francisco by Joanne Spetz, Lela Chu, and Lisel Blash (August 2022)

This study used data from two surveys conducted in California and other data sources to assess the current and future supply and demand of RNs. We find that RN employment rates have remained steady over the past four years, but many older RNs have left nursing.

In addition, a large proportion of older RN intends to retire or quit within the next two years. Many RNs report that childcare and school closures have made it difficult to work during the pandemic and reported they feel unsupported by their employers. The supply and demand projections estimate that a shortage of RNs now exists but will diminish as RN education enrollments return to and surpass pre pandemic levels.
