15	policies page 6 now reads: "Benefit program. Social
16	Security, Unemployment/State Disability Insurance/Paid
17	Family Leave, health insurance, life, and dental.
18	Permanent part-time employees are not eligible for
19	employer paid health insurance, life insurance, or dental
20	insurance. The American Legion Auxiliary, Department of
21	California reserves the right to amend or terminate the
22	benefit plans, excluding those benefits mandated by the
23	State and/or Federal government. Each employee will be
24	responsible to pay 30 percent or a minimum of \$100 per
25	month under health, life, and dental insurance." That's

what it reads. 1 2 It now reads: "Benefit program: Social 3 Security, unemployment/State Disability Insurance/Paid 4 Family leave, dental insurance at no cost to the employee. 5 Permanent part-time employees are not eligible for 6 employer paid health insurance, life insurance, or dental 7 insurance. Employees may be separated or 11 terminated at any time by the Secretary/Treasurer with the 12 approval of Department President with just cause or during 13 the probation period. A separated employee shall be paid 14 that salary and vacation time which they have accrued at 15 the date of discharge. No allowance will be paid for 16 accrued sick except as delineated above."

3	to Sunday. I was just asking to have the other weekends

5	I was just asking for that.
6	DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MIKESELL: Ann Philcox,
7	District 20.

8	DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MIKESELL: Is there any
9	further business?
10	DELEGATE NEWMAN: Madam President and
11	Department
12	DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MIKESELL: Cindy Newman,
13	District 13.
14	DELEGATE NEWMAN: Thank you. Madam President and
15	Department Officers, I first want to congratulate you on a
16	wonderful year. And I also want to congratulate the
17	Membership Chair and the membership on making their
18	numbers. However, the new business item I have is
19	regarding membership. I had concerns about the
20	on-the-floor purchase of memberships on Friday.
21	When we made our membership goal for California
22	in this room just a little while ago, half the membership
23	stood up, the other half did not. Out in the hallways
24	I've heard concerns from other members, so I'm going to
25	bring this forward as my own, but I know there is support.

1	I also have a recommendation. Our units in
2	District 13 and my Unit have paid for memberships in the
3	past for members who were in need or to make goal after a
4	vote of the membership when we were within 5 percent of
5	the goal. We're trying to clean up our membership and not
6	do that anymore because of the consequences that that has.
7	I recommend that we consider a standing rule to
8	either eliminate or limit the practice of paying for
9	memberships just to make goals. And this is because
10	purchasing memberships should be limited to those in need
11	and only with their permission. My concerns are that
12	membership is important, but we and I know we need to
13	show Congress our numbers, but we also need to show stable
14	growth. And this is like yo-yo dieting. That's my
15	concern. Purchasing membership is not sustainable.
16	(Applause.)
17	DELEGATE NEWMAN: Please, please. Purchasing
18	membership is not sustainable and artificially increases
19	our early bird goals. It also diminishes purchasing
20	memberships diminishes our membership in general and it
21	also diminishes the awards that many units work so hard
22	for that don't purchase memberships.
23	It also concerns me about what this says about
24	California and our integrity to other departments and
25	National. I think this needs to be a National
1	

1	conversation about limiting the purchasing of membership
2	to a percentage of your goal to provide a level playing
3	field for all units to compete. They all I think that
4	it also trains membership, members, it trains others not
5	to pay for their membership.

6 Those are my comments. I will be recommending to 7 my district membership chair to pursue this conversation and perhaps a standing rule that we limit it to 5 percent 8 9 of your membership to provide a level playing field for 10 So I would like to show Congress that we are a others. stable growing organization. I'm going to work very hard 11 12 to work that million mark when we get to our anniversary. 13 I'm a little uneasy about purchasing memberships. Thank 14 you for listen.

15 DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MIKESELL: Thank you, Cindy.16 (Applause.)

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MIKESELL: Our incoming
Department President Anita Biggs will be appointing a
committee to review this.

20 Madam National Vice President, do you have any 21 conversation about this?

22 NATIONAL VICE PRESIDENT BROWN-PARK: Membership 23 is a really tough thing. I've been a National Membership 24 Chairman. I took on that 18-month job at one point. And 25 I appreciate what you said and I don't disagree, but we do

1	set goals and we do try to make those goals. And how we
2	make those goals is really up to our president, and I
3	applaud her for what she did, I truly do.
4	(Applause.)
5	NATIONAL VICE PRESIDENT BROWN-PARK: I've done a
6	lot of research last year, and as I go on as National
7	President, we don't have a problem getting new members.
8	We have a problem keeping members.
9	(Applause.)
10	NATIONAL VICE PRESIDENT BROWN-PARK: So for those
11	I hope you will take the opportunity now that we have
12	done that and we have signed people up and we've helped
13	pay their dues and those may be people that we insulted
14	along the way, those may be people who can't afford it
15	right now with the economy, but we have an opportunity to
16	send them a letter that says we have paid your dues for
17	this year and we hope that next year you will continue
18	your service to the American Legion Auxiliary. I belong
19	to this organization because of the two men in my life:
20	my father and my husband. I honor their service by my
21	membership. And I hope that by paying these dues for
22	these people, these members, they're going to have that
23	opportunity again. And who knows. They may be happy to
24	come back and be members.
25	So, please, I appreciate what you said, but I

1	think this is an awesome thing that we've done. Thank
2	you.
3	DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MIKESELL: Thank you, Nancy.
4	Kathy Smith, District 12.
5	DELEGATE SMITH: Madam President, Kathy Smith,
б	District 12. And I just want to say that all of this
7	money, we need to remember, is going to help our veterans.
8	(Applause.)
