## PUBLIC RELATIONS REPORT

PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: Good morning. The convention committee on Public Relations/Editor met on June 19th, 2014 in Room 206 of the Santa Clara Convention Center, Santa Clara, California. The statistical report of this chairman appears on page 24 of the Book of Reports.

Jennifer Bieger was appointed secretary, Carrie Taylor offered prayer, and Jessica Gustonson was appointed sergeant-at-arms. A total of 16 district delegates answered roll call. There were five visitors present.

The committee agreed upon the following report: Prayer was offered. Code was read by Estella for Editor and by Tami Bell for Public Relations. We did not have any code changes.

Discussion regarding the press books was given. We discussed various applications for Facebook, social media, Instagram, and Twitter. A recommendation was made to create a form to be used for everybody that will be uniform regarding the release from parents and guardians to sign for pictures of children posting on social media that are not a member of our Auxiliary. The awards were passed out for second and third place units and second and third place districts.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Yeah. Tami, do you have a copy of the preconvention committee report for us?

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: So later in the department office make a copy so that we can have a copy with this report.

PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: Okay.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Thank you so much. You may continue.

PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: Thank you. The Department of California has completed the National Plan of Actions Public Relations program objective of promoting
the American Legion Auxiliary, its mission and goals in a positive image. We have given our districts and units a variety of resources that were available to us from our national website.

This Department Chairman teamed with the Department President and Department Membership Chairman in the national public awareness campaign. We sent out notification to our Department of California regarding the public service commercials to be aired restating our goal to increase awareness of our great organization and to ultimately increase membership.

We restated the mission of the Million Member March for our 100 year anniversary. We received the leads that came from the commercials and forwarded them to our district presidents and membership chairmen. We made personal phone calls to the leads, engaging the leads in inquiries as to what piqued their interest from the commercial, their military affiliation, and their interest in volunteering with our organization versus any other nonprofit. With such a large state as our Department of California, the follow up on the awareness campaign was quite a challenge.

We promoted the American Legion Auxiliary in the traditional manner, with 102 gifts of Auxiliary magazines given, pamphlets passed out at yellow ribbon events, brochures and membership application tables at Stand Downs, craft fairs, chili cookoffs, and also at our many events we participate in -- I've got a problem with those Ps too, Ruby -- we participate in for our active duty military and their families, including our Department of California sponsored Military Children's Spring Dance.

We published information about our Girls State program and our nurse's scholarships in local newspapers, fliers in our members' offices and breakrooms. Some of our members are able to publish information about our activities on their business websites.

The Department of California promoted the use of the public relations guide and tips for volunteer recruitment. We passed on information on how to write a letter to the editor, how to get information about our events and our activities to the local TV stations, radio, and cable. We found the public relations toolkit a valuable resource.

We had 446 newspaper articles published and 75 Op Ed articles published. The Department of California had 1147 interviews with reporters resulting in 31 aired events on $T V, 43$ radio spots, and two cable announcements.

We tried to jump into the new age of electronic media and social networking. This chairman concentrated on encouraging and teaching our membership how to set up
websites, Facebook pages, and Twitter accounts. Facebook seems to be the number one way our members are promoting our Auxiliary programs, activities by friend requesting other service organizations. Email today is the phone tree of yesterday. Almost all announcements and events submitted for newspaper articles go through email and Facebook. We had nine districts set up new Facebook pages, two new Twitter, and two new Instagram accounts. We realize the key to membership is through public relations.

And if I may, Madam President, give out my first place awards.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Yes, you may.
PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: I'm sorry I
didn't send a note ahead of time, but they're sitting in the front. First place is presented to District 19 for best supplemental report Public Relations.
(Applause.)
PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: First place unit supplemental is presented to Unit 314 , best supplemental report Public Relations.
(Applause.)
PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: Best use of social media is presented to George Tadlock, Unit 472 for their innovative use of the web to enhance the Auxiliary mission.
(Applause.)
PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: If I can have an additional point of privilege, Madam President?

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Yes, you may.
PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: As most of you know, our website is very extensive and whatever we put on the website goes up immediately. All of our pictures, our announcements, membership, everything like that. And I would like to present a special certificate of appreciation and these two cases of beer for our own Art Kapsalis.
(Applause.)
PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: Ruby, would you
like to come and accept this and take this to your home?
(Applause.)
PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: And because I am such a pain in the butt and always e-mailing Ruby about points of procedure and all this kind of stuff, I would like to present Ruby Kapsalis for taking care of our office so well and all of us this special certificate and this present. Thank you.
(Applause.)
PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: One more, Madam
President, if you don't mind.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Go right ahead. We have all day. Not.

PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: Ladies, as you
all know, we put on our second annual Military Children's Ball. And we could not have done it without the support of Madam President and without the support of all of you throughout the State of California, also our Legion Family. It is a tremendous effort that takes -- that takes the Military Children's Ball committee roughly six months to put on at a cost of $\$ 12,000$ this year.

So I would like to read you all in case you didn't see it on the email before a letter from my co-chairman Brandon Penn at California National Guard. "I just want wanted to thank you all once again for the tremendous and outstanding job you did on the Military Children's Spring Dance. I am literally floored at the amount of work, resources, and energy that you all put into your events. And from the bottom of my heart, I am thankful for you, your volunteers that you brought to help, some of them being your spouses, and for your dedication to military families.
"Notification of the event not only made it all the way to the National Guard Bureau in Washington D.C., but it even made it to the desk of the White House where the presidential and vice presidential First Ladies take interest in these sorts of events.
"The American Legion Auxiliary and the American Legion family continue to be an indispensable part of the support for service members and their families. PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: Tammy, can you come up here, please?

We have a gift for you, Madam President, if you would like to -- we'll come over there. We tried our hardest to shrink it down and we couldn't. These are the handprints from all the children at the dance, and on the other page is all of their names. And we hope that perhaps it can be posted up in the department office, unless you have a wall in your house for it.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Yeah, right. You know, I am so honored. I was so honored to attend the ball, and it was just amazing. And I hope next year many of you will be able to attend. It's something that you
can't imagine how grateful the families are that we are honoring them and the children. We're making them the littlest heroes, which they are. This is so special and I do -- when we move into our new district office back at the War Memorial Commission, I'm quite sure that we'll have that ready to be on the wall and framed because it's special.

And thank you, Tami Bell and Tammy Sollazzo, the entire committee that worked on this. There were quite a few hands involved, a lot of districts, a lot of money from all over the state, and a lot of obstacles that Tami overcame. And the letter that she read by Brandon, I did take an excerpt of that. You'll see that in my report, I guess, on the National Convention program. Because what he said at the end about us is true. We will help and we're available.

So thank you, Tami Bell. Outstanding work. And I heard so many people say I'm going to do that next year. So we're excited about next year with the spring dance for the kids. Thank you.
(Applause.)
PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN BELL: Thank you, everybody.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Before I go on, those of you who were at the banquet last night, did you have a good time? Did you like the Rat Pack? I fell in love with Joey Bishop. He was -- he had me in tears. He said, "I saw that $I$ had you crying." But it was so great. For any of you who missed it, it was a fantastic committee.

Linda Workman, you did a great job as usual. Thank you, Linda.
(Applause.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Well, we want to congratulate and thank all of you who have joined the President's Club for 2013-2014. I will be calling your name. Ruby has your card. She tore up some of them, but she knows how to make them again so it's okay. And we have your Italian charms, the basketball-themed charms.

So without further ado, ALA Unit 281, District 19; ALA Unit 259 at Cypress; myself, Tami Bell, Jennifer Bieger, LuAnn Capazzi, Diane DeLashmit, Kathryn Doran Katherine Duran, Linda Fercho, Geri Fitzpatrick, Ruby Kapsalis, Madeline Lee, Loretta Marsh, Kathie Martinez, Wendy O'Brien, Marlene Sho, Terry Snow, Rosalie Taylor, Vickie Donahue, Kim Vincent, Linda Workman, and Terry Mikesell.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Ruby has charms, so if anybody wants a charm today, please see her. And she has the applications. Just fill it out and you'll be part of the history of the President's Club, which is a great club to belong to. Thank you.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: While they're
getting their cards and charms, we'll have the report of our Convention Commission Chairman Melanie Taylor.

## CONVENTION COMMISSION REPORT

CONVENTION COMMISSION CHAIRMAN TAYLOR: And good morning, ladies.

AUDIENCE MEMBERS: Good morning.
CONVENTION COMMISSION CHAIRMAN TAYLOR: Madam Department President Anita, I would like to start my report out by telling you that this has been a trying year due to the fact that the Auxiliary Convention Commission was not invited to tour an approved convention site in Ontario, nor were they invited to attend the Ontario Commission's meeting. And the Department Vice President was told last November that she had to sign the convention agreement then, even before being elected as Department President.

At that time it was decided by the Auxiliary Convention Commission, the Department Vice President, and the 2015 Department Convention Chairman that an Ontario convention site needed to be secured.

This chairman sent a letter to the Ontario Convention City Commission requesting I be informed of the next meeting time and location in order for the Auxiliary Convention Commission to inspect the hotel and convention center to see if it met the Auxiliary's requirements before any contract was signed.

A site inspection of the Ontario Convention Center and the Doubletree Hotel was arranged for the Auxiliary Convention Commission on Sunday, May 4th. We were not able to see the Doubletree hotel fully due to time restraints. An inspection was also scheduled at the Ontario Airport Hotel as the possible Auxiliary Convention meeting site.

The main objective and concern was for the comfort and convenience of our Auxiliary members and not to alienate ourselves from the American Legion. The possibility of holding the 2015 Auxiliary Convention at
the Ontario Airport Hotel was discussed and voted upon Thursday morning at the department DEC meeting. The convention dates are June 24th through 28th, 2015.

Madam President, at this time $I$ move to accept the DEC recommendation to move the American Legion Auxiliary 2015 Convention to the Ontario Airport Hotel. NEC CHAIRMAN MIKESELL: Second.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: It has been moved and seconded to accept the Department Executive Committee recommendation to move the American Legion Auxiliary 2015 Convention to the Ontario Airport Hotel. Is there any discussion on this motion?
(No response.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Hearing none, all
those in favor say aye.
ALL PRESENT: Aye.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Those opposed say
no.
(No response.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Motion carried. CONVENTION COMMISSION CHAIRMAN TAYLOR: Thank
you, Madam President.
Ladies, this hotel is perfect for the Auxiliary. The room rate is $\$ 26$ per night cheaper than the Doubletree Hotel, with -- with adequate convention space. All the meeting rooms are on the first floor inside the hotel, except for the finance committee which will be on the second floor, with tiered chairs and tables so you're not juggling papers all over your lap. The atrium is perfect for the Past Presidents' Parley luncheon and the President's Banquet.

The Legion was invited to join the Auxiliary at the Ontario Airport Hotel and to set up their casino night there. There is a buffet, a coffee shop, a cocktail lounge, and Starbucks in the hotel lobby and box lunches will be available. A hospitality suite is available all four days and we can bring in our own food for the candidate's night reception.

There is complementary WiFi in all public areas and free shuttle to and from the Ontario Airport which is only two minutes away. Five minutes if you hit a red light. Ontario Mills shuttle will take us to the Ontario Mills Shopping Mall and nearby restaurants and the convention center, and parking is free. These are just a few of the comps that were on our list.

Now, Madam President, going on to the American Legion Department Convention Corporation, they had their last meeting at the 5th area meeting/annual chili cookoff and the Auxiliary Commission Member -- excuse me. Our Auxiliary Commission Member Norma DuVall was in attendance
and was asked to sit in as temporary secretary. They discussed the writing of the constitution and bylaws and securing the federal EIN number.

Sue Hooker and I were asked to be the elected trustees for the Department Convention Corporation, each serving for three years. The corporation will be taking over after the 2015 Ontario convention.

And a little update. I had to write this in because we did meet with the Department Convention Corporation Thursday after our meeting and we discussed the possibility of future conventions in separate hotels and not convention centers as they are very expensive. They are still working on obtaining their EIN number and changing it from a calendar year to a fiscal year. So I've instructed them how they need to do that with the IRS.

The 2016 Department Convention was going to be held in Fresno. It is not now as they have backed out, so I have no future convention dates for you at this moment, but hopefully we will be -- the Department Convention Corporation will be meeting again soon. I have been told that the DEC meeting, we don't know where it's at yet, but we will be discussing future convention sites then.

Madam President, this concludes my report.

CONVENTION COMMISSION CHAIRMAN TAYLOR: I'm
sorry. Madam President?
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Yes, Melanie. CONVENTION COMMISSION CHAIRMAN TAYLOR: I'm still a little tired from battling with Dino and his drink last night. I forgot to introduce the members on your
convention commission at this time.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Thank you.
CONVENTION COMMISSION CHAIRMAN TAYLOR: Norma
DuVall and Sue Hooker.
(Applause.)
CONVENTION COMMISSION CHAIRMAN TAYLOR: I want to thank these ladies for working on this Ontario Convention for 2015. I appreciate all their help very, very much. Thank you.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Thank you, ladies, for all your heart work traveling across the state. Thank you very much.

DELEGATE JOHANSEN: Madam President, may I have a
point of privilege?
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Yes, go ahead. DELEGATE JOHANSEN: This is -- excuse me. I'm Susie Johansen, delegate from Unit 243, District 24 . Does this mean we're trying to break away from the men going to
convention?
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: You mean we're going
to break from the American Legion?
DELEGATE JOHANSEN: No, no, from the conventions. DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: No. DELEGATE JOHANSEN: We will always be in
separate --
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: No, no, we won't
always be. We're just voting on this particular
convention for 2015. So we're going to be at a
separate -- we're not going to be at the Convention Center with the American Legion. We will be in a hotel and our convention will be contained there like it was last year in Palm Springs. We were in a hotel, you know, contained in one hotel. We didn't have to go back and forth to a convention center.

DELEGATE JOHANSEN: So in other words --
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Just for 2015. And then -- they're on the Convention Commission, the corporation, Melanie Taylor and Sue Hooker, are on that board with them for at least three years so that we will have more of a voice as to locations and amenities that we require for our members. We will not be -- we don't want to be treated as second-class citizens when it's time for us to have our convention.
(Applause.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: I agree.
DELEGATE JOHANSEN: I agree with you totally;
however, $I$ was just wondering, it seems like there's going to be a lot of work involved.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: It will be work involved, you know, but we work anyway. I mean, we have work to do when it comes to a convention. But trust me, the ladies that are in charge is the 25 th District, the 18th District. They are in well-versed in, you know, organizing and constructing these conventions.

(Applause.)
DETACHMENT COMMANDER FOX: My Sergeant-at-Arms
Gil Desmeules.
(Applause.)
DETACHMENT COMMANDER FOX: My Historian Mr.
Fisher.
(Applause.)
DETACHMENT COMMANDER FOX: And my Vice Commander starting with Area 1 Bill Bryant.
(Applause.)
DETACHMENT COMMANDER FOX: Number 2 Victor Henry.
(Applause.)
DETACHMENT COMMANDER FOX: Number 3 Mike LaToya. Excuse me. Number 4. Where is number 3? Number 3 is in the color guard. Number 4, Mike LaToya.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Excuse me,
Commander. One more minute. The Past Commander forgot one thing that -- a very important thing, ladies. Please
stay standing.
PAST DETACHMENT COMMANDER AFFOLTER: 2013-2014
Auxiliary Member of the Year goes to Tina Martin, Unit 365 from Vista, California.
(Applause.)
PAST DETACHMENT COMMANDER AFFOLTER: District 22.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: That's District 22.
Congratulations, Tina. Are you here? Okay. They'll have
her award for her at a later time. We don't have it here.
You don't need to come. It's not here. Well, they'll get
her award to her later.
Thank you all. Now we can continue with our processional of the detachment officers. Thank you, gentlemen, for coming in.
(Processional.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Ask and you shall
receive. Oh, for those who are still standing, you are so obedient. We have six new President's Club members

AUDIENCE MEMBER: Second.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: To the Chairman?
DISTINGUISHED GUEST CHAIRMAN WORKMAN: No, to
the --
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: That's the one you
said.
DISTINGUISHED GUEST CHAIRMAN WORKMAN: Okay.
Which one would be for the department -- there is no -- no account for our Department Convention, so I'm trying to think of the closest thing.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Wouldn't that need to go into 62471 for Department Convention expenses?

PARLIAMENTARIAN DeLASHMIT: Madam President, on page 7 it's WF68702 Scholarships - General. There's budgeted $\$ 8500$, and if we go through the code and add up all the scholarships that are offered, which I didn't do today but there weren't any changes from previous years, it amounts to about $\$ 13,000$ that we actually have available for scholarships. And yes, there is a disclaimer saying if we don't have the funds, we don't give the scholarships, but we do have the funds.

First off, there's an overage of -- I'm sorry. An under budget of $\$ 275$, which could be moved there. That doesn't give us much, but it's a little bit. And if you look at reserves for Education, we have $\$ 41,149$ in reserves. I'm not really stating that we need to go into reserves, but I don't think we need to be under budget and
not have at least that 275 moved to the scholarship so that we can offer those scholarships and not be limited to the 8500. So I so move that the 275 go into that column.

AUDIENCE MEMBER: Second.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: It has been moved and seconded to add $\$ 275$ to the line item WF68702
Scholarships - General for Education to make that $\$ 8,775$. Is there any discussion on that motion?
(No response.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Is everybody with
me? All those in favor, say aye.
ALL PRESENT: Aye.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Those opposed, say
no.
(No response.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Motion carried. The Chair recognizes the delegate at the mic. That's you.

COMMUNITY SERVICE CHAIRMAN CANNON: Kathie, just a question.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: You have to identify yourself for the record.

COMMUNITY SERVICE CHAIRMAN CANNON: Joan Cannon,
Unit 249, District 11, Community Service Chairman. Just a question. On page 4 right below GF62598, it's got the CA, California, Disaster Fund. Is that just where you're listing extra expenses? Because it kind of makes it look like that's part of Americanism to me and it's part of the Community Service.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Can you explain what line you're at? I'm sorry.

COMMUNITY SERVICE CHAIRMAN CANNON: GF62598.
That's Americanism Essay Wards/Grants. Underneath that is CA Disaster Fund Expense. Is that just where you're placing it, it doesn't --

FINANCE CHAIRMAN MARTINEZ: At the time the budget was created, we did not have a line item code to enter for California Disaster Fund Expense. It is a separate line item. We just did not have a line item number to insert.

COMMUNITY SERVICE CHAIRMAN CANNON: So you're
going to get one?
FINANCE CHAIRMAN MARTINEZ: Yeah, there will be a General Fund number associated to that expense. COMMUNITY SERVICE CHAIRMAN CANNON: Okay. Thank you. FINANCE CHAIRMAN MARTINEZ: You're welcome. DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Any further discussion on the amended -- we voted on the amendment; right? Yeah. Any further discussion on the motion? All those in favor of accepting the 2014-2015 budget as
amended, please say aye.
ALL PRESENT: Aye.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Any opposed say no.
(No response.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Motion carried.
Excellent job.
(Applause.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: They deserve a
standing ovation.
(Standing Ovation and Applause.)
FINANCE CHAIRMAN MARTINEZ: You all are going to make cry.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: This is by far one of the best budgets I've seen since coming to the convention. Thank you, Kathie Martinez. Outstanding job, Geri and Kathryn. I know she couldn't have done it without you all. I know that you have been an outstanding support.

FINANCE CHAIRMAN MARTINEZ: Madam President, if I might take just a minute and a half.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Yes, you may.
FINANCE CHAIRMAN MARTINEZ: Thank you. Or five. Yeah, because $I$ get five minutes; right? Ladies, I just need to say publicly, I have told these two ladies, our Department Acting Secretary Ruby Kapsalis how much I appreciate them, all of their hard work, but I need for you ladies to know and to hear that without their help, specially Kathryn, she is a computer whiz on getting everything lined up, checking for errors, getting it back to Ruby so that the corrections could be made in a timely manner in the office. And without these ladies, without their support, $I$ would be under a table somewhere. It is a team effort and I could not have worked with a better team this year. Thank you.
(Applause.)
FINANCE CHAIRMAN MARTINEZ: One last thing. The last two pages, ladies, are for information only. It is the proposed Girls State budget and Junior budget. So nothing to be presented; it's just for information. No, junior is zero. They're both there.

So, ladies, thank you again. And it's been a pleasure, Madam President. Thank you very much.

Whereas, Auxiliary units hold stand downs which focus on providing health and support services to homeless veterans.

Whereas, Auxiliaries strengthen their local
community by conducting food drives, visiting hospitals, and providing scholarships to young people.

Whereas, Auxiliaries serve as advocates for our nation's veterans and their families.

Whereas, units conduct welcome home and send off events for service members.

Whereas, Auxiliary members selflessly volunteer their services at Veteran Affairs facilities throughout the country to enhance the lives of America's veterans; and

Whereas, each year Auxiliary units raise millions
of dollars for cancer research.
Resolve, that the Senate: One, honors and recognizes the patriotism and countless contributions to the United States by generations of women in the Auxiliaries of our nation's veterans service organization.

Number 2, commend members of Auxiliaries in the
United States and abroad for their dedicated service to and support of our nation's service members, veterans, and their families and communities.

Number 3, encourages the people of the United States to promote awareness of the contributions and dedication to the members of Auxiliary to the members and veterans of United States Armed Forces.

And 4, calls on all Americans to heed the noble examples of the Auxiliaries of our nation's veteran services organizations and volunteer support and service to those who have selflessly served our nation."

(No response.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Motion carried.
ACTING SECRETARY/TREASURER KAPSALIS: These are
the minutes from the Preconvention Committee meeting held at Santa Clara Convention Center, Santa Clara, California

Thursday, June 19th, 2014.
Actions taken: The -- did someone give the court reporter a copy of this? There was an extra one for the court reporter. I didn't get it.

The Preconvention Department Executive Committee
meeting was called to order by President Anita Biggs at 7:00 a.m. Roll call of voting members were taken and actions of the District Presidents were presented and approved as attached.

Motion made by the finance committee for a 50 cent raise for Janeen Thomas. Discussion was held and motion amended by Linda Workman to give Janeen Thomas a 50 cent raise if she accepts the new position being presented and changes to the constitution and bylaws meeting if passed. Motion was seconded, and after considerable discussion Melanie Taylor moved the question and motion was approved as amended.

Melanie Taylor, Convention Commission Chairman, reported and distributed a detailed comparison of the 2015 convention in Ontario, California.

On May 4th, a site inspection of the Ontario Convention Center, the Doubletree Hotel, and Ontario Airport Hotel was arranged for the Commission Committee, the Department Vice President, and other American Legion Auxiliary members.

Rooms at the Doubletree Hotel are $\$ 115$ plus tax per night. You have to walk to the convention center from the hotel. The meeting rooms are adequate, but American Legion Auxiliary would be charged for water in these rooms and in the convention hall. Food can't be brought into the convention center and can only be ordered through their caterer. There is a cafe style dining in the convention lobby and possibly box lunches would be available. The Past Presidents' Parlay luncheon will be in the Convention Center. The President's banquet would be in the Doubletree Hotel, Ballroom A next to the American Legion Casino Night.

Rooms at the Ontario Airport Hotel are $\$ 89$ plus tax which is $\$ 2$ per night than the cheaper with adequate convention space.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Let her finish her minutes and we can correct them later.

ACTING SECRETARY/TREASURER KAPSALIS: All the
meeting rooms are on the first room inside the hotel. The atrium is perfect for the Past Presidents' Parlay luncheon and the President's Banquet. There is a buffet, coffee shop, cocktail lounge, and Starbucks in the hotel lobby and box lunches are available.

A hospitality suite is available all four days
and we can bring in our own food for the candidate's night reception. There is complementary WiFi in all public areas and a free shuttle to and from Ontario Airport, Ontario Mills Shopping Mall, nearby restaurants, and the convention center. These are just a few of the comps on the Commission Committee's list.

Melanie Taylor moved to change the 2015 American Legion Auxiliary Ontario Convention site to the Ontario Airport Hotel. Motion seconded, and after considerable discussion was approved.

DeLashmit, Sergeant-at-Arms Sharon Moore, Marshal Debbie Fletcher, Historian Tami Bell, and Chaplain Vella Myers. (Processional.)
INSTALLING OFFICER HOOKER: Will the Honorary
Sergeant-at-Arms and Marshal with the Distinguished Guest Chairman please escort the Junior Member of Finance Susan Peters.
(Processional.)
INSTALLING OFFICER HOOKER: Will the Honorary
Sergeant-at-Arms and Marshal with the Distinguished Guest Chairman please escort the Department Vice President Elect Susie Tozier escorted by her sister Anita Collins. (Processional.)
INSTALLING OFFICER HOOKER: Will the Honorary Sergeant-At-Arms and Marshal with the Distinguished Guest Chairman please present the colors of District 15 followed by the Department President Elect Harriet Clendenin escorted by her husband, Norm.
(Processional.)

INSTALLING OFFICER HOOKER: The principles of any group opposed to our form of government.

INSTALLING OFFICER HOOKER: That was the gavel. District Second District Vice Presidents, please rise.

(Response.)
INSTALLING OFFICER HOOKER: Thank you. Trust me I'm not taking it lightly. I'm just covering up my mistakes.

Our Honorary Chaplain Vicki Crow will offer
prayer.
HONORARY CHAPLAIN CROW: Please remain seated.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT CLENDENIN: I've been told I need to use my outdoor voice. Thank you, everyone -- my glasses.

INSTALLING OFFICER HOOKER: Right there.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT CLENDENIN: I don't see
them.
(Applause.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT CLENDENIN: Thank you,
honey.
Thank you, everyone. I am humbled and honored to have been elected to serve as President for the American Legion Auxiliary, Department of California for the 2014-2015 year. My theme this year will be C.R.A.F.T.S., Creating Relationships Assisting Families Through Service to Veterans in our communities.

(Applause.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT CLENDENIN: When I was in

Vice President Susie, Acting Secretary/Treasurer Ruby, Danielle White, and I developed an action plan to help California assist in this lofty goal. More details will follow in future leadership training. I encourage all members to attend.

(Applause.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT CLENDENIN: Do I know how to
pick 'em? I would be remiss if I didn't introduce my biggest supporters, my family. My mom, Debbie. My dad, Artie. My daughter, Lora. I'll get to you, honey. My brother, Elliott. He's the baby, but the tallest one in the family. My two aunts, Maryann and Phyllis and Phyllis' husband Joe who came out from New Jersey to be with us this weekend. Joe also wants me to tell you that he's my favorite uncle. Oh, and Janeen Heatherington. Where are you, sweetie?
(Applause.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT CLENDENIN: Last, but not
least, my eligibility, my best friend, and my gopher. My husband, Norm.
(Applause.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT CLENDENIN: Will all members of post and Unit 221 please stand? 221. 221. Thank you. Stay standing. Will all members of District 15 please stand?
(Applause.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT CLENDENIN: You may -- you can sit. In closing, let me again thank you for this honor of serving you. And remember, think creatively in your units and districts and your communities. God bless our veterans and God bless the USA.
(Applause.)
INSTALLING OFFICER HOOKER: Just a moment, please. I have in my program to ask for presentations to either of these ladies. For some reason that doesn't sound right to me, but I'll go ahead and follow the script. So at this time if there are any presentations from anyone.

PAST DEPARTMENT GOPHER FERCHO: Madam President, can I borrow your husband for a moment, please? You need to stand on that side so he doesn't run away.

DEPARTMENT GOPHER CLENDENIN: Got the handcuffs?
PAST DEPARTMENT GOPHER FERCHO: Now, Lonnie, you need to explain where the handcuffs and the gopher is.

PAST DEPARTMENT GOPHER FERCHO: But remember, happy wife, happy life.
(Applause.)
PAST DEPARTMENT GOPHER FERCHO: Raise your right

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hand and give your name where $I$ give mine. I, Dennis Fercho.
(Response.)
