JUNIOR ACTIVITIES CHAIRMAN FALKENBERG: Yes, ma'am. Good morning, ladies. We're going to do this one more time. Code changes -- the Junior Activities committee met Sunday morning at the Fresno Convention Center in the back of the room and agreed upon -- and agreed upon this report.

Code change recommended. Page 45, number 25, bullet number 2 currently reads: "The Junior Activities Chairman, Junior Conference Director, and the Committee will choose a Department Junior Delegate and Alternate to National Convention at Junior Conference. If the delegate turns 18 prior to or during the National Convention, she will be eligible to attend National Convention but will not be eligible to hold a National Office."

The committee agreed on the proposed change will read: "The Junior Activities Chairman, Junior Conference Director, and the committee will choose two Department Junior Representatives to Junior National Convention or Junior Mission Training at Junior Conference. The representatives may or may not be the Honorary Junior Department President or Honorary Junior Department Vice President, but must exhibit leadership qualities. If the representative turns 18 prior to or during the Junior National Convention or Junior Mission Training, she will be eligible to attend Junior National Convention or Junior Mission Training but will not be eligible to hold a National Office."

The rationale behind this is the original mission trainings are a temporary. They're trying it out at this time so we don't know whether it's going to stay mission training or will be going back. So this way the code will cover either way. So as directed from the committee, I so move.

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DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT TOZIER: It has been moved to change code number 2 to: "The Junior Activities Chairman, Junior Conference Director, and the committee will choose two Department Junior Representatives to Junior National Convention or Junior Mission Training at Junior Conference. The representatives may or may not be the Honorary Junior Department President or Honorary Junior Department Vice President, but must exhibit leadership qualities. If the representative turns 18 prior to or during the Junior National Convention or Junior Mission Training, she will be eligible to attend Junior National Convention or Junior Mission Training but will not be eligible to hold a National Office."

Bullet number 3 currently reads: "Airfare, $\$ 100$ per diem for two days and the registration fee will be paid for by the Department Office for the Delegate and Alternate to National Convention. Should the Delegate not be able to attend, the Alternate will move up to Delegate. The Department President, Junior Activities Chairman, Junior Conference Director, and Junior Conference Committee will select a Junior that attended the current year Junior Conference to attend as the Alternate. In the event that both Delegate and Alternate are unable to attend National Convention, the Department President, Junior Activities Chairman, Junior Conference Director and Junior Conference Committee will select two junior members that attended the current year Junior Conference to attend as the Delegate and Alternate."

The proposed change will read: "Airfare, \$100 per diem for two days and the registration fee will be paid for by the Department Office for the First
Representative to Junior National Convention or Junior Mission Training. Should the First Representative not be able to attend, the Second Representative will move up to First Representative. The Department President, Junior Activities Chairman, Junior Conference Director, and Junior Conference Committee will select a Junior that attended the current year Junior Conference to attend as the Second Representative. In the event that both the First Representative and Second Representative are unable to attend National Convention, Junior National Convention, or Junior Mission Training, the Department President,

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Junior Activities Chairman, Junior Conference Director and Junior Conference Committee will select two junior members that attended the current year Junior Conference to attend as the First Representative and Second Representative."

The rationale behind this is removing basically the words "delegate" and "alternate" to say first and second representative. I so move by rationale of the committee.

In the event that both the First Representative and Second Representative are unable to attend National Convention, Junior National Convention, or Junior Mission Training, the Department President, Junior Activities Chairman, Junior Conference Director and Junior Conference Committee will select two junior members that attended the current year Junior Conference to attend as the First
Representative and Second Representative."

The outgoing director shall coordinate with the Department Secretary to ensure all necessary paperwork is complete and forwarded to National."

The proposed change will read: "It shall be the responsibility of the Junior Conference Director to contact the parents/guardian of any Junior member that is selected as a representative to attend the Junior National Convention or Junior Mission Training to ensure they will have a chaperone while traveling to, from, and during the

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Junior National Convention or Junior Mission Training. The outgoing director shall coordinate with the Department Secretary to ensure all necessary paperwork is complete and forwarded to National."

By the direction of the committee, I so move.

The outgoing director shall coordinate with the Department Secretary to ensure all necessary paperwork is complete and forwarded to National."

            DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT TOZIER: Yes.
            AMERICANISM CHAIRMAN VINCENT: In keeping with
                Madam President's theme Growing the Legion Family for
                Veterans, we completed the year with 23 district reports
                including 13 with 100 percent reporting. Several active
                units were reported from districts -- several activities.
                Members continue to educate other members of the programs
                as well as the public on Americanism opportunities. We
                continue to reach new goals and soar to new heights.
            Knowledge is important when we think of flag
        history, etiquette, and proper disposal methods. Flag
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ceremonies are a time to educate students in proper display and retirement of the American flag. Furthermore, in an effort to educate our junior members, several of them actively participated in a flag retirement ceremony during the 2016 Junior Conference. Units delivered flag etiquette brochures and promoted patriotism and citizenship in schools. Legislative process booklets were also distributed. Comic books and rulers with the presidents were given to children and youth. There was also participation with Wreaths Across America.

Promoting the observation of patriotic holidays so our community will look to the American Legion Auxiliary is a wonderful opportunity for community outreach. Units presented American flags to individuals and businesses. In addition, units promoted flying the American flag daily. Patriotic holidays were recognized. Members organized and participated in Veterans Day and Old Glory Boat Parades, Memorial Day ceremonies, Prisoners of War and Missing in Action, and Patriot Day ceremonies, cards for the troops to send in care packages, and children prepared Hero Packs which included flags and Americanism materials.

Pocket flags, in upwards of 1550, were assembled and distributed. On Flag Day, Boy Scouts folded pocket flags to send in care packages. During the Junior Conference there was an opportunity for 40 plus junior members to learn how to properly fold pocket flags and learn the objective as to why we fold them and send to our active duty military serving overseas. Units supported the constitutional amendment to protect the United States flag from desecration. The amendment currently reads: "The Congress shall have power to prohibit the physical desecration of the flag of the United States."

Several units participate in Get Out the Vote. In Abraham Lincoln's second inaugural address, he promised to care for him who shall have borne the battle and for his widow and his orphan. Let us serve and honor the men and women who are America's veterans. This year's theme is how do we keep Lincoln's promise to our veterans and their families. Units promoted the National Americanism essay contest, receiving one at the national level. The department essay contest had 694 essays submitted at the unit level for judging. The Veronica Spence Award is given to junior members who submitted an essay, and I received five.

Promoting pride in belonging to the world's largest women's patriotic organization begins within our own units. Members showed their Auxiliary pride by wearing the Auxiliary pin, red, white, and blue attire, and singing patriotic songs during fundraisers and other

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unit events. Members highlighted contributions of veterans and attend and represented the Auxiliary at city council meetings. Members are given opportunities to speak with other organizations to share the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary.

Blue or gold star banners were presented to families, a military honor Christmas tree lighting ceremony took place, laminating blue stars with photos of our military, past and present, adorning the tree with a special place reserved for the gold star families.

Participation in the promotion of the American Legion Americanism programs included the Oratorical Contest and Legion Baseball where several units gave support.

Total dollars reportedly spent by the Department of California members was $\$ 32,811$ and total volunteer hours donated 597,441. This chairman is honored to report to you wonderful activities the Department of California members have participated in the year throughout 2015-2016 in order to serve our veterans, active duty service members, their families, and the children and youth in our communities.

MR. CONATY: So a little bit about myself. I spent 21 years in the Army, and then I got awarded for a dangerous job, I went to work for the State Capitol. I like to tell people after ten years working there at the State Capitol, I went to work for a lobbying firm. And I naturally gravitated to veterans issues, and the next thing you know, I'm representing about a billion veterans and their families in the State of California.

And as a result of that, we're able to pass a lot of legislation to help veterans, their families, active military and their families. As a matter of fact, we passed so much legislation I can't even keep up with it on what we've passed.

This year alone we have 80 bills, separate pieces

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of legislation, dealing with veterans and active duty and their families. Not all of them make it. A lot of them fall by the wayside because of funding. They lost a lot of money and the state doesn't want to fund it. So there's still 60 bills alive that are active. And they're very good bills. The ones we don't get through the first year, we double and triple down the next year.

And a lot of people are interested in
legislation. Let me see a show of hands of the people that like to be involved in legislation. Okay. That leaves more work for me. Slow down. Slow down. Okay. I'll talk slower. Okay.

So I will start working with the committees and your Chair. And I'm assuming that's what you would like to do?

DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT O'BRIEN: Yes.
MR. CONATY: And we will give you information and tell you how to get involved. We also have a National Legislative Day for the American Legion. I have some of you ladies that come to that, so we will be sure you know about that. And if we get enough people to come, we just might have a separate venue for you and everything else.

So I've got a few copies of the bills. And I know you're busy; I'm not going to spend a lot of time. Thank you so much for this. It's wonderful. And, you know, I can't say enough about everybody that helps veterans, and you ladies are -- I see a lot of familiar faces out here. So you ladies are the ones that keep us men going, if you will. So thank you very much. I hope you've had a successful convention.

Oh, one other thing I've got to talk about, and that is there's a ballot measure that will be on the ballot in November. And we have some information, we'll put it out. It is really meant for veterans and their families. It will drive up the prices of drugs at the Veterans Administration and the Department of Defense and it will cause havoc in the State of California. And all the veterans groups, including the Legion, have come out in opposition to it. So we'll leave you some information on that and I'll leave also a list of the most important bills that we have going.

Okay. Thank you very much for having me. (Applause.)

DR. ELLIS: Good morning, Fresno. My name is Dr. John Ellis. I have a doctorate degree in education from Oklahoma State University. I am a -- I was going to say former Marine, but once a Marine, always a Marine. Oo-rah.

Many of you may know what C.A.L.P.A. is. That's the acronym for the California American Legion Press Association. Now what's interesting about it, most of you have seen the program for the convention; correct? Every single individual in this program is a member of the California American Legion Press Association including Tozier.

Now how many of you out there right now aren't members of C.A.L.P.A.? Stand up. We've got a few. Thank you very much. Now isn't that an embarrassment? All right. Simply because we're not among the Auxiliary, in the past it has been thought that membership in the California American Legion Press Association was just for the Legionnaires, but that's not the case. Auxiliary members and Sons and Riders can belong to the Press Association, and I'm here to tell you why you should be too.

Number one is it's ten bucks a year. But what does C.A.L.P.A. do for you, the Auxiliary? We work with communication. Okay? Isn't that what it's all about, internal communications with our own members within our posts, external communications with the community at large. How do you do that? Well, what C.A.L.P.A. can do for you is help you design a flier if you needed it. If you have a special event, if there's a Valentine's Day dance or St. Patty's Day dinner, a pancake breakfast, any kind of fundraiser, we can do a 24-hour turnaround in color, professionally designed flyers at absolutely no cost to you. We can help you design a Facebook page. We can help you create one at no cost to you. If you don't have a website, we can point you in the right direction. We can help you develop your newsletter, lots of things. Press releases.

When $I$ first came into my post, the commander -we were having an event. I don't know who to contact or

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what they want. Besides, we're Navy guys. We don't know how to write ourselves out of a paper bag. Well, we can help you with the press release. All you've got to do is contact us and we'll write it for you, get it in the newspaper for you with photographs.

Now does that sound like something that would go a long way towards promoting the Legion? Absolutely yes. Because here's what happens when you get the word out. When you get the word out internally with your own members in the Auxiliary, when you get the word out with the community at large, four things happen: membership increases, membership retention increases, fundraising goals are elevated, 50/50 drawing, more tickets are sold, people donate. They buy more for the gift baskets, that sort of thing, and greater community recognition occurs.

So that's what we're all about. That is what the California American Legion Press Association is all about is helping you elevate your game, raising your game, helping the Legion grow. And what's really interesting and exciting for me is that this year's theme is what? Is team membership is, what? Full speed ahead. Right? Team membership full speed ahead.

So I'm here to invite you each to join the California American Legion Press Association. We will work with you one on one. All you have to do is send us an email, pickup a phone and give us a call, mention it to your commander. You do not have to be media savvy to be a member of the Press Association. You don't have to be an editor. All you have to do is care about your Auxiliary, to care about your post, to care about the Legion because that's what it's all about. And you're proving that by being right here at the convention.

So what I'm going to do is I'm going to leave a stack of membership applications. We have the address you can send ten bucks in. If you like your press card, you'll get it. It's a hard plastic press card. It will have your name on it and also we have a hat, pens, and lapel pins and that sort of thing. For ten bucks you can become a member of the Press Association.

And with that, I'd like to thank you for your time. And now what is a theme of this convention? It's team membership --

morning, Madam President, Distinguished Guests and Delegates. The Miracle Growers have been fabulous advocates for our veterans this year. Examples include units sending out thousands of letters to both state and federal officials. Units report thanking their
congressmen for sponsoring specific legislation and asking for support from others.

Units invite their local officials to attend parties in their post homes, and as a result have signed up a new member or two. One unit reported they attended a legislation networking workshop held at the Joint Forces Base. I wish there were more of those. Unit members help drive those that couldn't otherwise get to the election polls to vote.

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Many districts report supporting efforts for the Korean War Wall of Remembrance which will be located next to the Korean War Memorial in Washington D.C. One district chairman reported that she had ordered and passed out over 1,000 of the legislative process booklets that she had obtained. She and the district units gave them to schools and libraries in her area.

This program can seem to creep and crawl slowly, and all of a sudden the action alerts come in fast and furious. Yesterday, Saturday, I received two emails of importance. Before the July 4th recess, the senate will vote on VA funding. The American Legion is in support of this and are requesting us to contact our senators to ensure a favorable outcome.

And I know many of you have been waiting this news. Drum roll, please. House of Representatives voted June 22 nd to authorize an appropriation for the construction of the Veterans Affairs Facilities, including the long-waited hospital in French Camp serving Central Valley veterans.
(Applause.)
LEGISLATIVE CHAIRMAN CLENDENIN: The Miracle -yeah, a victory. Miracle Growers have been an important part of the crops this year as we grow the Legion family for our veterans.

Now I would like to give my first place awards. First Place Unit Supplemental that went to National went to Patricia Galatioto, Unit 422, District 25. And then First Place District Supplemental went to Stephanie Janji, Chairman, District 29.

I can report that the hotels and convention center more than meet our requirements and the Riverside Visitors and Convention Bureau are excited that the Legion family will be returning to their city.

The Legion and the Auxiliary will both be housed at the Marriott Riverside at the convention center.

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beautiful hotel, ladies. They remodeled. The DEC meeting Thursday morning and all preconvention meetings will be held in the convention center located just across the quad from the hotel. All meeting rooms and the Department Office will be located on the second floor of the convention center with the DEC meeting downstairs. The Past President Parley Luncheon and President's Banquet will be held in the convention center. The candidates reception Thursday evening will be held on the second level of the convention center indoors instead of outside in the heat.

During the meeting and tour with the American Legion and the Visitors and Convention Bureau staff, each were given a copy of the Auxiliary convention
requirements. These were addressed and I advised them that when the Department President makes her official tour, she will then sign the contract with the Convention City Commission.

As of now there is no bid for the 2018 convention which is to be held in the north. I have been told that Ontario has the bid for the 2019 convention with specific instructions to include the Auxiliary in all site inspections before any contract is signed.

President Susie and I found the need that these women need to develop a relationship with their children, so with the permission of U.S. Vets, they created a special room for us to make the Children's Learning Center Project.

In the project they've gone ahead and painted and

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made one wall with chalkboards so that the kids can draw pictures. And with the help of Past Department President Anita, I wrote a grant that we submitted to National, and fingers crossed, this last May we found out that we were awarded over \$8,000.

EDUCATION CHAIRMAN BELL: And with all of your donations to President Susie's Special Project, we've put together over close to about $\$ 18,000$. And working with Best Buy nationally and my teammate out of Best Buy Long Beach that created special use of eight top-of-the-line Apple computers, some laptops that the kids can create music using microphones so that they can have music therapy with their mothers, cameras for photography which they will go and -- go on outings with their mothers, and printers. And we also have a team from Best Buy that's going to go out and teach them how to use all of this equipment.

So we feel that this is a very worthwhile project, and with all of your help we wanted to thank you very much. And President Susie and I will be going in a couple of weeks to present the Womens Advance Program with a big truck. Best Buy is going to bring the truck with all the equipment and we're going to present them with this very special donation from the Department of California.
