CONSTITUTION \& BYLAWS CHAIRMAN COOLEY-DESMEULES:

He had a rough night last night, so I hope he stands up. His last appearance. The convention committee on Constitution --

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARSH: You know, I think what might be happening, I think we leave them on overnight and it --

CONSTITUTION \& BYLAWS CHAIRMAN COOLEY-DESMEULES: Okay. The convention committee on Constitution \& Bylaws met June 21st, 2018 in the Cherry Wood Room of the Crowne Plaza Hotel, Sacramento, California. The statistical -it's not staying on. It's flickering. Hello? Go back to my singing days; right?

Okay. The statistical report of this chairman appears on page 14 of the Book of Reports. Geni Lefler from District 14 was appointed secretary, Janet Payne, District 6 offered prayer, and Judie Tabacchi from 18 was appointed Sergeant-at-Arms. A total of 18 delegates answered roll call and we had three visitors.

The committee agreed upon the following report. The Constitution \& Bylaws department codes were read with only one small code change. It is -- I promise it's small. The code currently reads: "The adopted" --

CONSTITUTION \& BYLAWS CHAIRMAN COOLEY-DESMEULES: There we go. The code currently reads, number 2: "The adopted changes in the National Constitution and Bylaws shall be forwarded annually from the Department Office" -okay. Can you hear me now?

Number 2: "The adopted changes in National Constitution and Bylaws shall be forwarded annually from the Department Office as soon as they are received after the National Convention. Every Unit, District Department Chairman and Officer and Past Department President shall receive a free set attached to their existing copy. A change will be made" -- "a charge will be made for additional sets."

Our proposed code is, number 2: "The adopted changes in National Constitution and Bylaws shall be" -I'm sorry. I'm nervous up here.
"The adopted changes in National Constitution and Bylaws shall be posted annually on the Department Office Website as soon as they are received after the National Convention."

We are changing "forwarded" to "posted," changed "from" to "on," and inserted "website" after "the Department Office." This will eliminate the entire last
sentence.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARSH: Okay. Code change currently reads: "The adopted changes in National Constitution and Bylaws shall be forwarded annually from the Department Office as soon as they are received after the National Convention. Every Unit, District Department Chairman and Officer and Past Department President shall receive a free set attached to their existing copy. A charge will be made for additional sets."

The new proposed code will read: "The adopted changes in National Constitution and Bylaws shall be posted annually on the Department Office Website as soon as they are received after the National Convention."

I move to accept this change to Constitution -- number 2 of the Constitution \& Bylaws Department Code.

CONSTITUTION \& BYLAWS AD HOC COMMITTEE CONVENTION REPORT

DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN DeLASHMIT: Madam

President Loretta, I'm not sure whose idea this was to have us do all this work. Was it you, Anita, or Harriet? Because we started a long time ago. It was one of the two of them.

PAST PRESIDENTS PARLEY CLENDENIN: It's her, it's

PAST PRESIDENTS PARLEY CLENDENIN: Anita.

committee has worked very hard for four years to
consolidate and update our documents in keeping with government standards. I would like to present the other members of this committee. Terry Mikesell.

DEPARTMENT SECRETARY MIKESELL: Here.
DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN DeLASHMIT: I thought she was running out on us. And Melanie Taylor. We spent many days and hours trying to include all the previous documents and adding those that we couldn't find written anywhere to be included. Most recently in March we spent two days here in Sacramento working on our final draft. I'm not sure if $I$ ever want to tackle this kind of assignment again.

Some changes will not go into effect until 2019-'20 as appointments have already been made. We will also have to update the Model Bylaws, so continue to be patient with us as we move along slowly.

Now are we ready? We do not intend to read all 50 pages of this document. We will move only those that are relevant.

In the Constitution, the first part is the preamble, the eligibility and all of that. On page 3, Article III, Section 3 is Gold Star Members. We only added the -- an update last sentence on dates of hostilities to read as our document had not been corrected. "Operation Desert Shield/Storm/Gulf War/War on Terrorism." This is a mandate from National. There's no reason to vote on it.

Article IV still on page 4 -- 3. Article IV Department Officers, Section 1. Change "Marshal" to
"Assistant Sergeant-at-Arms" to be consistent with other departments. All references to "Marshal" will now, if passed, will now be automatically changed to Assistant

Sergeant-at-Arms.
By direction of the committee I move this change. DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARSH: It has been moved and seconded that we change the name of "Marshal" to "Sergeant-at-Arms" in all the places that it applies. DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN DeLASHMIT: It would be "Assistant Sergeant-at-Arms."

And my understanding is this is a trend across the nation and it is for continuity. It's a big job and while you're learning, you might not pick up everything the first year, and so a lot of the units across the -- all the states are adopting this practice and new policy. So this is not new to a lot of states, they've been doing this for a while. We heard both sides at the meeting and a lot of the units that were doing this across the other states really have benefited from it. So I am in favor. They have more pros than cons.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARSH: Thank you. Chair recognizes Susie Tozier.

PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT TOZIER: Susie Tozier, District 22, Unit 6. I just a year ago completed being NEC and it is very intimidating the first year because you really don't know what you're doing. DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN DeLASHMIT: It should be. I have so many pieces of paper on Constitution \& Bylaws, I don't even know what I'm reading from. And when you have 15 copies of 50 pages each like what are we doing here.

Okay. Well, we -- a little bit of discussion on that, whether it's Musician or Music Chairman. In our opinion on the committee was that it should be Music Chairman and not Musician. Musician implies that there's an instrument, a piano or something, a guitar or whatever,

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARSH: Page 5, Section 2 at
the very top.

DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN DeLASHMIT: Where it says, "NEC woman" in parentheses.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN BIGGS: You're still on the Constitution?

DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN DeLASHMIT: I'm still

on the Constitution. You were not given that? It's about eight pages long.

PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT BIGGS: Are you reading from this?

So the first one is: "The American Legion Auxiliary Department of California is chartered by the National Executive Committee of the American Legion Auxiliary and is comprised of districts and units attached to posts of the American Legion and all nonaffiliated unit members," those are Headquarters Unit 1000, "within the State of California. The Department of California charter is

signed by the National President of the National Secretary."

One through 3, I can go ahead and read them, but there really is nothing to vote on here. "The Department of California American Legion Auxiliary shall have the authority to create intermediate bodies between the Units and Department to act as a liaison between such organizations and for the purpose of promoting the programs of the American Legion Auxiliary."

Section 3 is: "The Department shall have authority to create and charter new units and the Department will act as the liaison between such organizations and the National Organization for the purpose of promoting the programs of the American Legion Auxiliary. The Department shall also have authority to create and charter intermediate bodies called Districts between the Units and Department to act as a liaison between such organizations in the purpose of promoting the program of the American Legion Auxiliary. An intermediate body shall be administratively subject to the Department and totally under Department jurisdiction. The Department Executive Committee shall have the authority to set forth responsibilities and limits of all intermediate bodies. In no event shall these responsibilities established by the Department Executive Committee usurp the prerogatives

of the National Organization, Departments, and Units."
All of that is just changed to make it California rather than very general. Let's see. By direction of the committee I move to pass Sections 1 through 3.

AUDIENCE MEMBER: Second.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT MARSH: It has been moved and seconded that Sections 1, 2 and 3 be passed as read to comply with the Department of California. Is there any discussion?

This committee shall meet in advance of the other preconvention committee meetings to allow ample time to properly assign the Resolutions to the other preconvention committees prior to their convening. This committee has no authority to take any action on a Resolution other than to refer to it to the appropriate preconvention committee unless there is a written opinion from the Counsel General that a Resolution is illegal and can cause the organization, its officers, its Department Executive Committee Members, appointees and other members to become liable. In such an event, the committee on Resolutions shall report said action to the Department Convention Delegate.
"A. Resolutions pertaining to finance are to be at the Department Office not later than 60 days prior to
[Page 438]
the opening of the following Department Convention." That's the same as we've always had or at least for a long time.
"All Resolutions other than the above must be in the Department Office 45 days prior to the following Department Convention. Exceptions to this may be made to allow the presenting of emergency resolutions not later than noon on the second day of convention.
"C. All resolutions will be numbered in Department, one copy to be kept in the office files, the remaining resolutions to be sent to the Department Resolutions Chairman within five days after being received by Department Office. She in turn will direct them to their respective committees. Note: Emergency Resolutions are those which arise during the convention or after the date established for admitting them.
"D. At the preconvention meeting the committee on Resolutions, resolutions not written within the jurisdiction of any of the preconvention committee shall be presented for explanation by a member of the committee on Resolutions. Upon conclusion of discussion of each resolution, the committee may vote either to, $A$, recommend to the Department Convention delegates that a proposed resolution be adopted; $B$, recommend to the Department Convention delegate that a proposed resolution not be
[Page 439]
adopted; or $C$, make no recommendation to the Department Convention delegates regarding a proposed resolution. Each member of the committee on Resolutions and one representative from each district shall be entitled to vote on the recommendations to be made to the Department Convention delegates. The committee on Resolutions shall be report its activity to the Department Convention delegates."

"2. Authority to set convention. In the event it is not feasible to hold a convention at the same date and city as that of the American Legion, the Convention Commission may determine by investigation where our convention could be held and report their findings to the Department Executive Committee and/or Corporation for consideration." That has not changed.
"3. The Department President after conferring with the Department Vice President shall appoint the Department Convention host city chairman and co-chairman two years in advance of the scheduled convention. She is charged with preparation of the preliminary plans and local arrangements for the Department Convention. If the convention city is changed during this period, the

FINANCE CHAIRMAN HAYES: That's what they voted on the other day.

JUNIOR FINANCE MEMBER ROMANO: What you voted on. Okay. So we no longer have that 30,000 in there. We put it in the other line item. Okay. So we're changing that number. Display Case, 3,093. National Candidate, 500. So Total General Fund Restricted is $236,489.27$ minus the 30,000, so it would be the $206,489.27$. And then on the Reserves, you also have to change that amount. No, we don't. So it's 185,103.51. Okay.

Minor correction. I misspoke on the Total

General Fund Program Expense. That should remain the 537,860 -- $I$ mean 806. The only -- the only one that's

Okay. Summary of Welfare Programs. Poppy Production Fund Income is $\$ 61,615$. Welfare Program for VAR \$48,500. Sorry. Welfare Fund Children \& Youth, 6500. Welfare Fund Education/Income, \$14,750. I apologize. Sometimes it's hard to keep on the correct line. Past Presidents Parley, 7800, for a total income of $\$ 138,165$.

Expenses. Poppy Production Fund Expense, \$54, 995. VAR, \$35,225. Children \& Youth, 6500. Education, 17,600, and PPP, \$12,970, for a Total Expense of 127,290. For a total net of 11,875. And the reserves VA\&4 has a reserve of $\$ 109,784.21 . \quad$ Children \& Youth has a reserve of $31,366.92$. Education has a reserve of

40,328.89. Past Presidents Parley has a reserve of 42,569.39, and the Poppy fund has a reserve of 15,693, making a Total Welfare Reserves of $\$ 239,742.41$.

FINANCE CHAIRMAN HAYES: Okay. The Junior and Girls State budgets are for your information only. Let's see. By direction of the Finance Committee, I move that the budget be approved.

AUDIENCE MEMBER: Second.
