The committee agreed upon the following. The code was read and there were no changes.
(Applause.)
AEF CHAIR ROCHA-CARLOS: 100 percent reporting certificates were awarded to District 2, 4, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 15, 16, 18, 21, 22, 26, and 28. The second place best district and unit supplemental reporting certificates were announced. No third place awards were given.

The Chair thanked District Chairmen for their end of the year reports and the work that they did for the AEF this year. A closing prayer was given and the meeting adjourned at 10:55 a.m.

Madam President, may \(I\) continue with my statistical report?

DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: Yes, you may.

AEF CHAIR ROCHA-CARLOS: Thank you. We experience disasters daily throughout our country and our state. Rainstorms, flooding, excessive snowfall, earthquakes, tornados, and fires just to name a few. Department of California Districts and Units have prepared themselves to assist immediately, knowing the urgency when funds are needed. Some examples of projects and events held by units to raise funds for AEF are --
(Applause.)
AEF CHAIR ROCHA-CARLOS: I'm not done.

DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: She's just taking a breath. It will just be a minute.

AEF CHAIR ROCHA-CARLOS: The Gonzales Unit 81 AEF Chairman organized a cupcake walk fundraiser that took place on October 15th, 2022 during the City's 75th Anniversary. Nine Auxiliary members volunteered a total of 20 hours baking 20 dozen cupcakes and setting up and helping to make the event run smoothly. The cupcake walk is very similar to an old fashioned cake walk and 325 happy participants took part.

Apple Valley Unit 256 passes around a collection jar for AEF donations. Everyone attending the meeting contributes what they can, which was \(\$ 65.70\) this year.

District 18 members held some fundraising events for AEF, including breakfasts, Taco Tuesdays, opportunity
drawings, luncheons just to name a few.
Now on to numbers. The California Department of California has 30 districts with 22 of them reporting. A combined total of 786.25 was given to AEF by four districts. Eighty-six units actively support the AEF. The total amount donated from these units is \(\$ 4,893.76\).

Fifty-four units have a line item in their annual budgets for AEF. There are five units that discussed an increase in their AEF budget.

Nine units held fundraisers for the AEF that included meals, opportunity drawings, and passing a jar around to collect donations at meetings just to name a few.

Four members reported submitting applications for assistance, three members reported submitting applications for emergency assistance, and three members reported submitting applications for education assistance.

Fifty-seven units actively shared information about the AEF program. AEF brochures, applications were made available to members. Nine units reported distributing AEF applications to members.

Nine Auxiliary members donated \(\$ 100\) or more to the Auxiliary Emergency Fund.

District 25 has a 25th District American Legion Family Facebook page. On this Facebook page you can see all the wonderful events and fundraisers that are going on
in their district. One of their events is the Walk For Kids which is an annual Legion Family fundraiser that supports the children and families who rely on its life changing service that the Ronald McDonald House located in the Inland Empire offers. A member even came down from Wrightwood to attend the tamale fest in this district. Way to go regarding getting the word out.

Not only did the District 25 submit an article to the ALA National Magazine, but a junior from Unit 299 was featured on the cover.
(Applause.)
PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIR SMITH: District 22 has a Legion newspaper that is issued quarterly which includes articles written by the Auxiliary. This District also has a District website along with a Facebook page. Most of the units within this district have a Facebook page. This district held an auction via Zoom to help recruit from the pandemic as a fundraiser and it was a great success. Talk about thinking out the box.

District 2 when they launched their Facebook page this year, it was announced on their local news station. District 27 had two units develop a local media list and three of the units were on their local radio station. Some units ordered 100 assorted ALA brochures from the department that were distributed to schools and

American Legion posts.
District 19 has -- over half the unit has social media accounts including Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter.

District 18 gives a gift subscription of the ALA magazine to their local public libraries, doctor office, and dentist offices.

The Department of California is using the Public Relations program to its full potential. Many units and districts are doing such a great job with this program that I am unable to mention all in this work -- all their work in this report.

The committee on Finance met on June 22nd at 9:06 a.m. in the Oak Room of the Wyndham Hotel. Senior Member Kathy Tellyer served as secretary and Junior Member Teresa

Nunez served as chaplain. And Kathie Martinez, you know what a hard person she is, she served as sergeant-at-arms. She kept everybody in line.

Prayer was offered and the pledge was recited. A total of 18 district delegates answered roll call and there was one visitor present. The committee agreed upon the following report. The code was read and exceptions for several housekeeping changes were submitted and the following code changes are for your approval.

Department Code No. 9. We want to change the amount from \(\$ 25\) to \(\$ 35\). So department Code No. 9 now reads: "A fee of \(\$ 25\) will be charged to any Unit, District, Department Officers and Chairman, Past Department Presidents, and individual members who wish to receive bimonthly mailings in paper form. All recipients of bimonthly mailing via email will not be charged."

Department Code No. 9 will then read: "A fee of \(\$ 35\) will be charged to any Unit, District, Department Officers and Chairman, Past Department Presidents, and individual members who wish to receive bimonthly mailings in paper form. June 30 will be reimbursed by check to each unit within 30
days after fiscal year end."
Madam President, by direction of the committee I
move the acceptance of this code change.
DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: We have a
motion on the floor to change Code No. 10 to now read:
"The sum of all outstanding credits not expended by fiscal
year end June 30th will be reimbursement by check to each
unit within 30 days after fiscal year end."
Any discussion?
(No response.)
DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: All those in
favor.
ALL DELEGATES: Aye.
DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: Opposed?
(No response.)
DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: Motion
carried.
FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: There was discussion that

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ensued regarding the new California state law regarding exempt employees' minimum salary. It was determined that DEC approval was needed. This action was taken care of at the DEC following the opening at this convention.

There was discussion in regards to how checks were written and et cetera. And I really won't go into it, but if you are writing a check for your Girls State fees, please don't put the payee as or who it's payable to to Girls State. It's the American Legion Auxiliary Department of California earmarked for Girls State. So just be careful and let your treasurers know how to write their checks properly.

There being -- well, we read the budget and there being no further changes, the meeting was adjourned at 11:23 a.m.

So now for the fun stuff, guys. Yeah, is everybody happy this morning? Because we're going to read the budget. Yay, yay. Now I was going to be very, very nice and give everybody the revised budget that was revised in committee. So \(I\) went to Office Depot, and when I put my little thumb drive in and typed out how many I needed, \(I\) saw how much it was going to cost. I'm sorry, I only get 50 bucks and it was like almost \(\$ 1,000\) to do it. So what I'm going to do, I'm going to read to you -- we're going to try -- there were a few changes, so when
    those changes come up, we'll try to let you know that that
    one was changed.

And, Liz, I'm going to email you the budget once it's approved here and you're going to email it out to the list of emails. Is that okay?

DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I can do that.
DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: I didn't have a copy.

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: So actually we will -oh, here, everybody.

DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: So the conversation between them was that Liz will email out the budget?

DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yes.
FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: So we're going to start with -- I'm not going to read the GL number. We're just going to read the description line if that's okay. It gets a little confusing.

Okay. Online dues \(\$ 208,000\). The Americanism donations \(\$ 5,000\). Dues membership seniors, juniors \(\$ 180,000\). Dues for Unit \(1000 \$ 4,500\). Postage income \$1,000. Department supply orders \$100. Ways \& Means other \(\$ 3,000\). Current Department President pins, that's the -- like the choo-choo train she got this time, \(\$ 3,000\). Donations for In-Loving Tribute \(\$ 1,000\). President's Club
\$100. Interest income unrestricted \(\$ 100\). Admin income other accounts \$9,250.

Fidelity bond. This year all units will be paying up. You know, we called up and had everybody pay at the same time. So this year is your year. That's \(\$ 5,200\).

Delegate fees for convention \(\$ 18,000\). Income reimbursement from National \$500. Department Convention proceedings \(\$ 300\). The California disaster fund \(\$ 3,500\). Live units \(\$ 4,500\). Department President's special project \(\$ 8,000\). Department Convention Banquet \(\$ 9,000\), which is kind of a wash. You know, they pay and so it will be the same.

Department Presidents -- Department Past Presidents Parley luncheon \(\$ 7,000\). Mid-year DEC meals \(\$ 4,500\). General fund miscellaneous \(\$ 400\). National Convention income \(\$ 2,500\). National candidate -- national campaign fund \(\$ 500\), for a general fund program income of \(\$ 478,950\).

So we'll move on to the expenses. Salary 6400. 64,000. Sorry, Liz, you got a real drop in pay there. She loves this organization and just wants to do what's right. Okay?

DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: I do, but I have two children.

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: \$64,000. Sorry. Payroll taxes SDI 6,400. Insurance and Medicare 3,500. Supplies 3,000. Postage mailing services 2,500. Telephone telegraph -- telecommunications. Telegraph. Beep, beep, beep, beep, beep. You know, when we were on the train that's how they did it; right? I mean, you know.

DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: That's -- that's why my salary got put down.

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: 1,200. I'm glad we can all have a sense of humor. Okay. Workmen's comp insurance \(\$ 500\). Equipment rental and maintenance \(\$ 1200\). No, that's -- I'm sorry. Where are we? \(\$ 5,000\). This is very small. The lines are really tight. The rent for the War Memorial Building \(\$ 2,400\). Fidelity bond \(\$ 5,200\). Finance company, we're not taking any money. We're just zooming all the time so that's a blank.

Accounting and audit \(\$ 16,500\). Payroll services \$2,000. Auxiliary News editor \$50. Finance Chair \$50. If only my fingers here. Filing fees for the FTB fees is \$400. Bank fees and return checks \$400. New equipment or office equipment \(\$ 1,000\). Management fees, that's Sierra Financial that does our investments, \$2500. Charitable trust \(\$ 150\), giving us a General Fund Administrative Expense of \(\$ 117,950\).

So now we'll move on to general fund expense other expenses. Okay. So we've got National Dues \$125,000. Turn the page. Department President's Pins \$2,000. Ways \& Means \$50. Department President's Special Project \(\$ 8,000\). Membership for PUFL 2,500. Live unit access \(\$ 5,000\). Temp admin staff expense is nothing because it's Robin Falkenberg and I. We're temps and we're really cheap, so --

LEADERSHIP CHAIR FALKENBERG: That we are. FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: Online dues \(\$ 170,000\). General fund miscellaneous \(\$ 400\), for a general fund other admin expense \(\$ 315,350\). So where are we right now. General fund, the admin expense total is \(\$ 433,300\). So you want to do executive expense seeming how you're such an executive?

FINANCE COMMITTEE TELLYER: Executive expense. So Department President \(\$ 8,000\). Department Vice President \$200. District Presidents \$5,000. Training and program workshops \(\$ 5,000\). Parliamentarian \(\$ 2500\). Authorized travel by Department President \(\$ 400\). Executive Committee Meeting \(\$ 22,000\). Distinguished Guest \(\$ 400\). Secretary and Treasurer travel \$500. National Candidates Reserve \$500. National President's visit \(\$ 1500\). Officers and Chairmen Liability \(\$ 1400\). Music Chairman allowance \(\$ 2500\)-- or \$25. General fund executive expenses is \(\$ 44,950\). General
fund outsourcing, micro project management company \(\$ 40,044\).

So next is the general fund convention expense. Department Convention including mileage is \(\$ 8,000\). Department Convention proceedings \(\$ 1,000\). Convention Reporter \(\$ 7500\). Convention Commission Chair \(\$ 200\). Department Convention Chair \(\$ 150\). ALA convention expenses \$20,000. National Convention \(\$ 5,000\). General fund convention expenses is \(\$ 41,850\).

General fund committee and chair expense. Auxiliary Emergency Fund Chair \$50. Americanism Chair \$75. Constitutional \& Bylaws Chair \$250. Chaplain Memorial Program Chair \(\$ 300\). Community Service Chair \$100. Historian Chair \(\$ 250\). Junior Activities Chair \(\$ 50\). Leadership Chair \(\$ 150\). Legislative Chair \(\$ 50\). Membership UD\&R Chair \(\$ 600\). This is for six servicewomen to attend convention. We didn't have any this year.

California Disaster Fund \$3500. Americanism Essay Awards \(\$ 6200\), per code. Americanism Admin Fee \(\$ 1,250\). For a general fund committee chair of \(\$ 13,725\). The general fund expense is \(\$ 573,869\).

So going through the program expense, admin

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: And, ladies, you will notice that all of the --

DELEGATES: We can't hear you.
FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: If you would have looked in your Book of Reports, you would have noticed all the blanks of donations that came in. That's what happens when there are so many blanks. Even if your unit sends in five, \(\$ 10\), it helps out. So please, please ask your units to please send in their donations.

DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: Okay.
Under -- part of the line is cut off, but it's part of the
code number. Okay. It's on -- for page 2 at the bottom
it says Membership/UDR Chairman. I don't think we want
those together. It's two separate chairmen.

POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: Martha Romano, District 24. I have a question. On the Salute to Activity Duty, because we voted on having the 2500 , so it got reduced to 250.

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: Where are you?
POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: Oh, I'm sorry. On GS62504.
DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: Top of page 3.
POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: On mine it says page 2.
FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: What's the header?
POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: The header says, "General
Fund Committee and Chair Expense."
FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: Okay.
POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: And this is 62504, so linked to Active Duty Servicewoman. Because we had voted to create that line item when it was -- I was in Finance and to put money in there. And we have been putting money in there. It got reduced to 250 so -- to cover six servicewomen to attend. What was the rationale to reduce it if we have six?

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: We haven't had one for a while and they've moved that to another -- National

Security.
POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: Right, but the expense still remains; right? Because if we do have one -- I understand they moved it to a different program, but in our -- in our budget, it wouldn't be impacted because the expense would still remain.

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: Well, we figured, and I'm sorry to say this, but we figured because we're already in a deficit budget, we have not had anyone attend for the last three years, that we would put a minimal in there. And then that could be approved at the point if we do start having people, then the Finance and the Department President could approve travel rather than just hitting a deficit budget a little higher and higher each time.

POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: Okay. I just -- I know that we had a lot of discussion and it took a vote to actually put that in there.

My second one on the Poppy awards, it just says Miss Poppy awards, but there's a Poppy Poster Contest. So there's two awards, but it only had one line item. And that's on page 3.

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: Yes.
POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: Poppy Production fund
expense. I think the amount is accurate, but it should be for awards, not just Miss Poppy.

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: Okay. That's how the GL was written a long time, so we will correct that and take Miss Poppy out.

POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: And then my last one under micro project management page 2.

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: Yes.

POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: I thought we voted just for a one-year extension.

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: We're still -- we still
have them working for us. That's part of our --
POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: I thought we were -- that that one-year contract is expiring, but it doesn't -- so it doesn't have a date. I just wanted to confirm that we only did -- the last time we voted was a one year and it was expiring.

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: And it was until

September -- oh, go ahead, Susie.

DEPARTMENT TREASURER TOZIER: Susie Tozier, District 22. It was originally a two-year extension. We decided to do it, split the two years up. So we have one more year on the contract.

POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: Okay. So my suggestion is just to put the expiration of the term or the term of the contract on there.

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: And actually we don't put
expiration on our court reporter, we don't expiration on our auditors, we don't put expiration on any of those other fees. So, I mean, we can do that, but then we would have to do it for all outside --

POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: Well, the court reporter we do it annually anyway.

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: Right.
POPPY CHAIR ROMANO: So it does expire. It's understood it expires every year. And that was the only one we did on a multiple year.

FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: Okay. We will add that to that. Thank you.

DISTRICT 25 DELEGATE BELL: Madam President, if I may. Tami Bell, District 25, Unit 835. I would just like it noted for the court reporter and for the rest of the body that we cannot speak intelligently to the budget unless we can actually look at it.

You are reading out all of these numbers. We possibly cannot even remember or even comprehend what you are saying because we can't see it. It would have been very fair to perhaps email the budget out to us so that everybody could have printed it out and brought it with us. I do understand that it was very expensive to print it out, but we cannot intelligently speak to it and vote on it as a body of the State of California American Legion
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Auxiliary unless we can see it.
FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: And, Tami, can I address
that? Because we used to have --
DISTRICT 25 DELEGATE BELL: Yes.
FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: We had some units that
would donate the copy machine in the office and it was
very easy for those copies to be made. And unfortunately
we don't have a copy machine in the office this year. And
I really apologize. If we would have known that, we would
have sent out.

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                            DISTRICT 25 DELEGATE BELL: Thank you, Linda. I
        do understand.
                            FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: Yeah, we'll do that for
        future reference. Actually I think by the time the budget
        is prepared, it's going to change in committee obviously,
        but perhaps the budget should be put in the Book of
        Reports and then everyone can register and see it in the
        Book of Reports.
            DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: Thank you,
        Tami.
            DEPARTMENT CHAPLAIN HUSTON: Grace Huston,
        District 11, Unit 249. Sometimes you can rent a copy
        machine and maybe that might be something we want to add
        to the budget.
            FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: And that's what we used
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to do. We used to rent a copy machine to have in the
office.
DEPARTMENT CHAPLAIN HUSTON: Oh, that was the
donation.
FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: Yes, yes.
DEPARTMENT CHAPLAIN HUSTON: Thank you.
FINANCE CHAIR WORKMAN: Someone else paid for it,
the Department didn't.
Thank you, Pacific Palisades, wherever you may
be.
DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: Any other
questions?
(No response.)
DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: Is that it?
LEADERSHIP CHAIR FALKENBERG: Oh, I'll use my
teacher voice. Is there any way that in the future if you
don't have a copy --
DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: Identify

DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: All those
opposed.

DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: Motion carries. We thank you very, very much. Have we missed any chairmen for a report? It looks like it's going to be me. So give me one second here to figure out my piles because she has her stuff.

Oops, we have the Advisory Committee.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE CONVENTION REPORT

ADVISORY COMMITTEE DeLASHMIT: Good morning. Madam President, the Advisory Committee -- oh, there she
is. Okay. First want to tell you there's no code changes. We don't have a code. This has been an exhausting year on our Friendship Train with a few incidences of coming off the tracks.

Hopefully we have added some new passengers that have come aboard and not losing any along the way. My assistant here is Madeline Lee. And by the way, Ruby Kapsalis is also on this committee, but she was not able to attend. She was going to send me a message, but \(I\) think I left home too early so I didn't get it.

So Madeline.
ADVISORY COMMITTEE LEE: Well, I want to say
thank you for this appointment, but I didn't do very much advising. I had to rely on the big partner over here. But I wanted to thank everybody for all of the support that \(I\) received on the loss of my husband of 63 years this year. And without this Friendship Train and my strength in God, I wouldn't have made it through. And I would like thank everybody for that.

And as far as the train, the train fell off a little bit, but we made it to the end.
(Applause.)
ADVISORY COMMITTEE LEE: And we have served tremendously our veterans, our children, and our communities.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE DeLASHMIT: Thank you, Madeline. I too want to thank everyone. It has been a great convention in as much as everywhere I turned, I had help. And it didn't matter who it was or where you're from or whatever, there are good people out there. We only hear about the bad ones, but truly there are a lot of good people in not only our organization, but in the public.

So, Madam President, thank you for the experience of assisting when needed so that we will have fond memories of your year as our engineer. It has been a pleasure to serve you. DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Thank both of you.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE LEE: Rock on. Toot-toot. DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Toot-toot. DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: Okay. We have a guest so will the Distinguished Guest Chairman along with the Sergeant-at-Arms and Assistant Sergeant-at-Arms please escort her to the podium. (Processional.)

LEGION BASEBALL REP LEONARDI: Just don't scream. Some of you heard me speak before. Hi, everyone. I'm Judy Leonardi. I'm actually an Auxiliary president, or I was for the past four years, in District 22. But \(I\) have
been speaking on American Legion Baseball so I'm the spokesperson for the Department of California.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You go, girl.
LEGION BASEBALL REP LEONARDI: Thank you so much. So, ladies, we all have kids and grandkids. You are grandmas, you are moms, you are aunts, you are sisters, you are nieces. And it is built into us to nurture our youngins. Yes or yes? Absolutely.

And so with that, we all know the value of life lessons, especially learned through sports. And we all know the value of patriotism which is so needed in this country with our young Americans today. So if you don't know about American Legion Baseball, it was started in 1925. And Babe Ruth was the director of operations. Yes, he was. He believed in our program so much, even though he never played Legion Baseball, that he went around the country promoting it. That's huge.

Do you know that Ted Williams, Yogi Berra, Albert Pujois, Tony Gwynn are all playing American Legion Baseball? Or did. And there's 75 percent who do go on to college. 51 percent go on to the major leagues. Over 80 are inducted into the Hall of Fame. So we are a national institution that has survived World War I, great prosperity, and national tragedies and we are still here.

American Legion Baseball is a program that's been around for almost 100 years. Unfortunately as I go around to speak, nobody knows what the word "veteran" means. We do. I think we take it for granted. I know I did, but these young Americans have no idea when your fathers, your grandfathers, your sons, your relatives, whoever served in the military know what they did to serve our country so we can all live freely in the greatest country in the world. And they need to know that; right? Absolutely. So American Legion Baseball was always in Northern California in Yountville. It's extremely expensive for any family to go up there. We have decided -- not we. Excuse me. Past Department Commander Ed Grimsley decided to move it. There's a lot of people who know nothing about Legion Baseball, but now they do. Because we were in the Fresno area the past two years. And let me give a shout out to District 14 who were servant leaders who sat in the heat from sunrise to sunset over 103 degrees every single day. And a lot of them are right there.
(Applause.)
LEGION BASEBALL REP LEONARDI: They gave up their time, their donations, and resources. We are now at UCLA in the next two years next month. Guess what? For the first time ever we are going to have our own American

Legion Auxiliary all women's color guard opening ceremony. (Applause.)

LEGION BASEBALL REP LEONARDI: You guys happen to know who that is; right? Yes. So being an Auxiliary member and knowing of them, who do you think asked? I want this to be known out there because, you know what, the Auxiliary are the backbone of American Legion because they go out there and support our veterans; right? So I want to make sure that everybody knows about the Auxiliary.

But unfortunately District 14, Jackie Robinson Unit -- where is Ronald Reagan Post 295 or Unit 291? 282. I'm so sorry. You guys are our major sponsors for the past two years. And New Port Harbor 291 are the only Auxiliary, except for Vista and 365 in District 22, who have supported American Legion Baseball. I think we need to jump on the train, no pun intended; correct? Yes.

And so as a mom of three who are all in college, single mom, yeah, guess what my four letter word is? And it starts with an F. Free. Right? So with free, we are going to have every single individual enter the Jackie Robinson stadium on July 20 through the 24 th for free.
(Applause.)
LEGION BASEBALL REP LEONARDI: We used to charge, but not now. There's no parking fee from us either. So
we encourage your support in attending those games because these kids need to know. If they overhear you guys talking about your past experience as a dependent, as a wife, as a daughter, as a mom of a veteran, don't you think it would encourage them to listen a little bit more? And guess what? The side effect of you guys being there, we need new members. A lot of these teams have no idea that they are qualified to be Sons of the American Legion, let alone their moms or sisters or grandmothers are eligible to be part of the Auxiliary. And we need more people to step up. Amen? DELEGATES: Amen.

LEGION BASEBALL REP LEONARDI: Absolutely. Guess what? Jackie Robinson Post is sponsoring the uniforms for our eight teams.
(Applause.)
LEGION BASEBALL REP LEONARDI: Anita, do you have one of those pins available? To help sponsor the teams that are -- they're going to each be branches of the military as well as law enforcement and first responders. And when you see these uniforms, you're going to be glad you're an American Legion Auxiliary member because these uniforms are amazing.

And for them to sponsor the uniforms, they are going to be selling these pins when they get more of it.

And they are -- they are a picture of Jackie Robinson. They are top-notch, first class. I encourage you to donate because we need those uniforms out there. They are beautiful.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: How much are they?
LEGION BASEBALL REP LEONARDI: They are \(\$ 20\).
DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: My son, Lonnie Biggs, is a member of Jackie Robinson SAL his life, his whole life. And he opened a company called Xclusive Pins. And his first pin he designed was a Jackie Robinson pin with Jackie Robinson at the bat. And they're gorgeous. He just did a wonderful job. And it was his idea to do this pin, charge \(\$ 20\). And \(\$ 5\) for the purchase of the pin goes to Jackie Robinson Post 252 for the support of the American Legion Baseball.

So my problem is I don't have any more pins with me. I sold out on the way up and -- but I can take orders or you can go on his website and order there directly and get it, you know, delivered to your home. I can pass around a list, take your orders, and then I can get the pins to you.

PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT FERCHO: I will be the first one here.

DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: I appreciate your support. It's such a great idea.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: What's the website?
DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: It's xclusive, without the E. So it starts \(X-C-L-U-S-I-V-E, p i n s\), P-I-N-S, altogether, dot com. You can order them online. UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Repeat that, please. DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS:
xclusivepins.com. Xclusive without the E. So start X-C-L-U-S-I-V-E-P-I-N-S.com. xclusivepins.com. Him and his wife. I can't leave out Brandy; she's the master mind behind everything he does. But this is -- this is -thank you for coming because we were able to promote this. And I was almost going to tell him drive up here to Visalia and bring your pins because he could have done that as well. But we'll take the orders and you guys can order online. Thank you.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: It says they're sold out. DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: Oh, they're sold out already? He has them and we can get them to you. I'll make a list, pass it around. Okay?

LEGION BASEBALL REP LEONARDI: So, ladies, do you know how important you are? You're very important. Like I said, you guys are the backbone. We need your support. The VFW believed in our program so much that they put their money where their believe was and they were our 2021 major sponsors of our programs. That's huge; right?

Last year was the first time American Legion families came together and supported it. It cost \(\$ 100,000\) to be at UCLA and to house these boys. When I was just over there at the Sons and at the Legionnaires, they passed the hat around and they were able to raise over \(\$ 2,000\) from each group. My goal is to raise \(\$ 20,000\) by the end of this weekend. I have raised \(\$ 17,384\), so we only need about \(\$ 2500\) more.

So if you guys so choose to donate cash, check, or charge is so acceptable, just send in a check. And please email me that you did because we want your recognition on the board that's going all over the stadium and at the banquet, if we do have a banquet, to American Legion Baseball. And send it to the Department of California. And it's extremely important to put baseball on there. We want the funds to go directly to baseball and not to the general funds.

And I will definitely make a poster board, and I should have brought it; \(I\) am so sorry, but it has little checks and it says each post or each individual donating and the amount. And I want to make sure a special one is made for the Department of California Auxiliary. Any questions?

CONSTITUTION \& BYLAWS CONVENTION REPORT

CONSTITUTIONS \& BYLAWS CHAIR SCHULTZ: Okay. We can still say good morning. Good morning. Good morning, Madam President, and welcome back.

The convention committee on Constitutions \& Bylaws met on June 22nd, 2023 -- this fly is trying to get in my mouth -- in the Cedar Room. The statistical report of this chairman was inserted into the Book of Reports because I'll have to tell you I'm really sorry \(I\) was late.

And if you're late, that's what happens, you don't get included.

With the approval of the committee, Jennifer Turner was appointed as secretary, Fran Roseman offered prayer, and Maureen O'Brien-Sacco was appointed sergeant-at-arms. There were a total of 18 district delegates answering roll call and there were two visitors.

We did unfortunately have a code change. Actually two of them. And it is number 6(a). "When rewriting the Unit Bylaws, two complete sets" -- this is as it is now. I'm sorry.
"When rewriting the Unit Bylaws, two complete sets (including five signature pages) are required for submission to the Department Chairman. Three signature pages will be returned" -- it really wants me -- "will be returned to the Unit after the Department President signs them. The signature pages are to be attached to three copies of the new Unit Constitution \& Bylaws."

The proposed change reads: "When rewriting the
Unit Bylaws, mail two copies or two complete sets (including five signature pages) to the Department Chairman. Three signature pages will be returned to the unit after the Department President signs them. The signature pages are to be attached to three copies of the new Unit Constitution \& Bylaws. If submitting by email,
only one copy is required."
By direction of the committee, I move for approval of this code change.

DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: The President needs a copy. She doesn't have a copy of the --

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Are there any questions?
(No response.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: All in favor. ALL DELEGAteS: Aye.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: All opposed. (No response.)

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Motion is carried. You were very quiet. You didn't have any discussion, did you?

CONSTITUTIONS \& BYLAWS CHAIR SCHULTZ: Okay. The next one is 6(b), and it currently reads: "When District Bylaws are rewritten, two complete sets, including four signature pages, are required for submission to the Department Chairman. (2014)."

The proposed change for \(6(\mathrm{~b})\) is: "When District Bylaws are rewritten, two complete sets, including four signature pages, are required for submission to the Department Chairman. Two signature pages will be returned to the District after the Department President signs them.

The signature pages are to be attached to the new District Constitution \& Bylaws."

Upon recommendation from the committee, I move for the acceptance of this code change.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Are there any questions?

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: All in favor,
please say aye.
ALL DELEGATES: Aye.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: All opposed, no. (No response.)

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Motion granted.
DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: Thank you. My next changes will be on the Department Constitution, and it's Article III Eligibility. And I'm not sure if I need to read the whole thing. All I'm doing is adding Space -- Space Force. I'm sorry.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Space Force. DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: Space Force. Madam President, do you want me to read it all?

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: I think you should read it.

DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: You need to read the entire Eligibility.

DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: No. It's start of the Constitution change.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: This is Article III?

DEPARTMENT VICE PRESIDENT SCHULTZ: Yes, Article III, Section 3 proposed change: "Gold Star Members. Entitled to wear Gold Star pins are mothers, wives, sisters, daughters, granddaughters, and great granddaughters, and grandmothers of one who was regularly enlisted, drafted, inducted, or commissioned and who was accepted for and assigned for and assigned to active duty in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Air Force, or Space Force of the United States who served in either of the following periods: April 6th, 1917 to April 11th, 1918 and any other time after December 7th, 1941 or who, being a citizen of the United States at the time of their entry therein served on active duty in the Armed Forces of any governments associated with the United States during any of the said wars or hostilities, and who did not refuse on conscientious, political or other grounds to subject himself/herself to military discipline or unqualified service; or who was separated from service under circumstances amounting to dishonorable discharge which has been subsequently restored to an honorable status, and who died during such service. (2023)."

Madam President, upon direction of the committee I move the acceptance of this change. DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Are there any questions?
(No response.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: All in favor, say aye.

ALL DELEGATES: Aye. DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: All opposed. (No response.) DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Motion granted. CONSTITUTIONS \& BYLAWS CHAIR SCHULTZ: Thank you.
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Number 2, Article V, Department Executive Committee.

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Proposed change. And the proposed change is changing "NEC
Person" to "National Executive Committee Person."
    Do you want me to read the whole thing?
    DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: I'm trying to
find out where you are right now.
    DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: Which
correction are you on?
    DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: I don't see it.
    DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: Article V.
    CONSTITUTIONS \& BYLAWS CHAIR SCHULTZ: Article V,
Section 2.
    DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: So Article III?

CONSTITUTIONS \& BYLAWS CHAIR SCHULTZ: Article V, Section 2.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Go ahead and read it, Glenda. I just don't have it.

CONSTITUTIONS \& BYLAWS CHAIR SCHULTZ: Sorry. My copies got passed out early and so I didn't have enough copies for everybody up here so it's a little bit confusing.

So the proposed change on Article V reads, Section 2 reads: "The Department Executive Committee shall be comprised of the Department President, Department Vice President, Junior Past Department President (National Executive Committee Person), Parliamentarian, Department Secretary, Department Treasurer, District Presidents, District Chairmen of Standing Committees, Members of the Finance Committee, Girls State, Director and Junior Conference Director all with voting privileges. The Department Secretary, Treasurer (if paid) and Parliamentarian shall be a non-voting member of the Executive Committee and a voting member of the Department Convention. (2023)."

Madam President, upon direction of the committee I move for the acceptance of this code change.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Is there any
discussion on the code change?

DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: Yeah, I don't see the change, Glenda. Plus when you read it, you said "District President," then you said "District Chairman," which should say "Department Chairman" for outstanding committees. But what is the change?

CONSTITUTIONS \& BYLAWS CHAIR SCHULTZ: The change is from "NEC Person," spelling it out to "National Executive Committee Person."

DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: So you should further state -- you should -- you should further state because NEC Person was in parentheses to reflect it being the Junior Past Department President, that is a change to make it another designation and a comma to National Executive Committee Person. That's the actual change. It's two people, not one.

CONSTITUTIONS \& BYLAWS CHAIR SCHULTZ: Okay. So --

DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: I just want the body to understand that's the actual change. Because the Junior Past used to be automatically the National Executive Committee. Now we're electing a National Executive Committee Person. It should be designated there are two separate people with a comma, not parentheses.

    County Councils and the California Girls State Alumnae
Foundation are subsidiary organizations, and then it says
the proposed change is the California Girls State Alumnae
Foundation.
DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: You've got the
wrong one.
DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: This refers to
association. This is foundation.
DEPARTMENT PARLIAMENTARIAN BIGGS: But our
current bylaws state "association."
DEPARTMENT SECRETARY DOIDGE: Yeah.
ADVISORY COMMITTEE DeLASHMIT: Okay. Then this
paper is written incorrectly.
CONSTITUTIONS \& BYLAWS CHAIR SCHULTZ: Sorry,
Diane, maybe I gave you the wrong one.
ADVISORY COMMITTEE DeLASHMIT: Oh, okay. Thank
you.

I do have -- under Bylaws I do have a lot of changes that actually are housekeeping, and that is anywhere that it talks about revoking or suspending a charter, according to National they've already changed theirs and it was be cancellation instead of revoking or suspending. So all through the rest of the Standing Rules where that appears, that will be changed with housekeeping.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Thank you.
CONSTITUTIONS \& BYLAWS CHAIR SCHULTZ: So under Personnel Policies, \(I\) did receive some changes from the Finance Committee that were passed on. And the first one is Terms of Employment. "Terms of employment for regular employees, nonexempt employees covered" -- should have said the proposed change.
"Terms of employment of regular employees, nonexempt employees covered under the State of California and the Federal Wage and Hour Law are subject to payment for overtime. This includes hourly and clerical staff. The exempt employees. Staff who is exempt from State of California and the Federal Wage and Hour Law regarding payment of overtime because of managerial responsibilities." So we're just adding in "State of California."

This law was change the first of the year. So upon recommendation of the committee, I'm asking for -- I'm moving for acceptance of the changes.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Are there any questions?

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: All in favor, say aye.

ALL DELEGATES: Aye.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: All opposed.

Those days now are New Years Day, Martin Luther King Day, Presidents' Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans' Day, Thanksgiving Day, Thanksgiving Friday, Christmas Day.

On department of -- excuse me. On recommendation of the committee, I'm asking -- I'm moving that we should -- I'm moving to include Juneteenth as a paid holiday. It's not as a national holiday. It's not a national holiday, no.

    holiday. Federal holiday, but not a California holiday,

And that rationale is more candidates and more delegates that go, the more money to fund convention and the more information that comes back to the departments.

So \(I\) don't know that \(I\) need it as a motion, a motion to support Minnesota. I don't have it -- do you have it? I'm sorry.

DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Who has it?
CONSTITUTIONS \& BYLAWS CHAIR SCHULTZ: No, no, I'm not asking for a paper to write on. Does somebody else have the amendment? I saw it. I do have it, thanks to my committee member.

Okay. This amendment will be presented to the delegates at the ALA Department of California for consideration to align with Minnesota in support of this amendment. If adopted, we'll restructure the delegate composition by Department to allow more delegate strength by department at ALA National Convention.

Change is: No. 1: Delegates per Department allowed from five to seven. No. 2: Delegates for each major fraction thereof changed from 1500 to 1200 . Example. Currently we have 17 delegates total. Going forward with the same membership, they would have 22
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delegates total.
ALA Department of California Constitution \&
Bylaws Committee recommends adoption. The ALA Department
of California Constitution \& Bylaws Committee recommends
the adoption of this amendment and encourages California
to join Minnesota in support.
Madam President, upon recommendation from the
committee, I move the acceptance of this change.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Are there any

in favor say aye.
ALL DELEGATES: Aye.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: All opposed.
(No response.)
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Motion carried.
CONSTITUTIONS \& BYLAWS CHAIR SCHULTZ: Thank you.
Madam President, may I continue with my report.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Yes.
CONSTITUTIONS \& BYLAWS CHAIR SCHULTZ: Madam
President Gloria, our Units and Districts have worked
diligently all year long making sure that their governing
documents were in order. Five districts and 68 units
submitted rewrites of their Constitution \& Bylaws. I

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received 22 end-of-the-year reports and nine supplemental reports. I would like to personally say thank you to those that were so proud of what their Units and Districts accomplished that they took the time to proudly report their accomplishments.

One unit reported spending Constitution Day, September 17 th , which is the day in 1787 that our constitution was signed, with 370 children at a local Orange County elementary school. The post's color guard proudly presented the colors for the school-wide assembly. A unit member gave an informative speech about the history and meaning of the United States Constitution. Each grade level participated by presenting a patriotic song or poem reciting the preamble to the constitution.

Another unit had an initiation ceremony for new members. They provided new members with a copy of updated Unit Bylaws and Standing Rules along with a new member kit, a poppy, a U.S. flag, a unit pin, and a member benefits brochure. They went the extra mile in educating their new members. Great work done by great people.

My 100 percent reporting awards along with the second and third place supplemental report award winners were presented in our preconvention meeting.

going on, we only have a dollar for this time around. But
that's okay, we did the other thing. But I want to
present Ms. Gloria with this box from Tina for her
mementos.
(Applause.)
DISTRICT 20 PRESIDENT HARVILLE: Thank you very
much for letting me do this. And I do have plans for the
next president coming in. Tina has already got her ideas
going.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Thank you very
much. Bye, Tina.
PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT TAYLOR: Wait a minute.
I want that baby. Wait a minute.
DEPARTMENT PRESIDENT WILLIAMS: Okay. Are we
ready for Ways \& Means?
Okay. Ways \& Means Chairman.

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        WAYS \& MEANS CONVENTION REPORT

WAYS \& MEANS CHAIR BEERY: Okay. I know everybody is ready to go home, but we had a wonderful year so please be patient with me. My name is Mahala Beery. I am the Ways \& Means Chairman for '23-'24. This is Marcia Munroe. She is on the Ways \& Means committee. And we are the Ways \& Means committee. And we worked.

Marcia, I couldn't have done it without you. You truly have been wonderful. She mentored toward me. I'm brand-new chairman. I was touched. Thank you.

I'm kind of like Wendy O'Brien, so forgive me. Just go with the flow. I'm okay.

We started the year by ordering railroad themed table rolls, tablecloths, numbers, pictures of railcars for the bags used to collect tickets for all the donated baskets or items for our opportunity drawings. We ordered tickets, so many tickets. And I arrived here with I thought plenty of tickets and we had to go get more.
(Applause.)
WAYS \& MEANS CHAIR BEERY: Last year at the end of convention, \(I\) was given two large plastic totes and they were full of Past Department President pins, Past Department President charms, and other items. I knew I couldn't load them in my car by myself because there were too heavy. I come by myself.

But I do want to send a special thank you to

Barbara Garrison and Angie Ayon from Panorama City who was here last year. And those two girls loaded those totes and took them home for me on their own. And one of those totes probably weighs over 50 pounds. Truly impossible for me to lift.

And at this convention -- some of you got them. There weren't a lot of them, but some of you got them. The little hand crocheted poppy earrings. And I had told her at the beginning of last year, you know what would sell like hotcakes, if \(I\) could find somebody that could crochet those little poppies. And I'm telling all of you, if you don't have a pair, I'm sorry, but if you know how to crochet and you're willing to crochet and donate to the Ways \& Means committee, we sold them for \(\$ 10\) each and you can help the next Ways \& Means Chairman.

But thank you very much, Marion. You are fabulous.

WAYS \& MEANS CHAIR BEERY: So at the Clovis workshop -- I'm a brand-new chairman. I arrived. I didn't know anything. I didn't even know \(I\) was supposed to have a report. Okay. My mentor here clued me in, thank God, but we came away from Clovis having collected \$1,879.
(Applause.)

trip to Wine Country. I planned it around the Hayward workshop. So I took all that stuff up to Hayward. We didn't sell a lot, but \(I\) was there and it helped. So we got \(I\) believe it was \(\$ 72\) at Hayward.

WAYS \& MEANS CHAIR BEERY: And then we went to Hollywood. Well, Hollywood, you know, I mean who doesn't love Hollywood. And if you haven't been in that post, you're really missing something. But at the Hollywood workshop we did pretty well because basically I didn't ask for opportunity baskets, but \(I\) had the pins and charms. We told \$221 worth at Hollywood.

So for the three workshops we had \(\$ 2,172\) collected. I do also want to give a special thank you to Laurie Kellgreen who is from my unit and my friend because she helped me at the southern workshop in Hollywood because I didn't have anybody else to help because Marcia lives up north, of course.

So thank you, Laura, for being so kind.

exhibit common sense and professionalism.
Employees are expected to demonstrate good judgment and professional taste. Courtesy towards coworkers and your professional image to coworkers are the factors you need to use to assess whether you are dressing in business attire that is appropriate. We will deal with employees who wear business attire that is inappropriate in this workplace on an individual basis rather than subjecting all employees to a more stringent dress code for appropriate business attire.
